Pursuant to 42 CFR Section 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for long term care services to reflect enacted State legislation as follows:

- Effective for the period April 1, 2004 through March 31, 2005, for residential health care facilities, the assessment and subsequent reimbursement of same, on each facility's gross receipts, excluding

gross receipts attributable to payments received from Medicare, shall be reduced from five percent to two and one-half percent.

- Effective April 1, 2005 and thereafter, for residential health care facilities, the assessment and subsequent reimbursement of same, on each facility's gross receipts, excluding gross receipts attributable to payments received from Medicare, shall be eliminated.

The estimated annual aggregate savings in Medicaid expenditures is approximately \$165,900,000 for the April 1, 2004 through March 31, 2005 period and \$331,800,000 for each annual period thereafter.

In F-2002-0708, Rochester Gas and Electric, 89 East Avenue, Rochester, NY, 14649, propose to renew the Operating License (OL) for the R.E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant for an additional 20 year period. R.E. Ginna is located in the town of Ontario, New York, in the northwest corner of Wayne County and on the south shore of Lake Ontario. The plant has a pressurized water reactor with the capability to produce 490 net megawatts of electric power. Plant cooling is provided by a once-through cooling system to remove waste heat from the reactor steam-electric system. Cooling water is withdrawn from Lake Ontario. Current measures to mitigate the environmental impacts of plant operation were found to be adequate, and therefore no additional mitigation measures are being proposed. Ginna produces enough electricity to supply the needs of approximately 560,000 residential customers. The current OL expires on September 18, 2009. By letter dated July 30, 2002, RG&E submitted an application to the NRC (RG&E 2002) to renew this OL for an additional 20 years of operation (i.e., until September 18, 2029).

In F-2003-1071, Beacon River Pool Committee, PO Box 527, Beacon, NY, 12508, proposes to construct a prototype River Pool in the Hudson River on the north side of Riverfront Park in the City of Beacon, Dutchess County. The 20-foot diameter structure would be in the water from June to October, and then be stored on shore during the cold winter months. The prototype pool is a protective netting submerged 12 inches below the water surface to provide a safe area for wading. The water of the Hudson River would flow through the permeable pool enclosure. The floor of the pool is made of tensioned steel mesh held by a steel tubular ring. The sides of the pool, acting as a guardrail, are steel fence panels. Perimeter flotation and a buoyancy control system ensure positive buoyancy. The pool floor would be made of four different net materials, each covering a quadrant of the circular floor. Each high-strength net would have a different opening size, and each size would be evaluated for compatibility with estuarine habitat criteria. The experiment with different floor materials would inform the design of a potential future River Pool.
