Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services

Pursuant to 42 CFR section 447.205, the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services proposes to amend Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan by adding inpatient psychiatric services for individuals under 21 years of age who are admitted to residential rehabilitation services for youth programs that are certified by the Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services. The proposed amendment would create a new residential treatment service for individuals under 21 years of age who are chemically dependent. The facility would provide active treatment including structured therapeutic activities including clinical and recreation services. The facility would also provide certain medical and educational services. Individuals eligible for Medicaid at the time of admission would only be admitted upon approval by an independent preadmission committee.

Upon full implementation (after three years), statewide aggregate Medicaid expenditures including federal, State, and local shares, and including estimated trend factors for each year, are estimated to be \$40,350,000 annually. Implementation is expected to commence on January 1, 2006.
