PUBLIC NOTICE Department of Labor Single Source Exemption For Extension for Capacity Building Contracts Awarded under the NYSDOL Capacity Building RFP 26-G-Revised Original Release Date - 02/05/01

Under provisions of the federal Workforce Investment Act, the Department had previously awarded contracts to two vendors (the Center for Workforce Learning and the New York Association of Training and Employment Professionals) for the provision of various capacity-building services and activities. The intent of these awards was to enhance the ability of New York State workforce development professionals and partners to: deliver excellent service to business and job-seeking customers; successfully carry out their roles as members of the one-stop career center system; and, to successfully implement all aspects of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998.

The original awards provided for the annual re-funding of resulting agreements for a maximum period of up to five years, which started on July 1, 2001 and ended on June 30, 2006.

The Department is currently in the process of finalizing a re-procurement solicitation for delivery of capacity building services by qualified vendors to cover a new five year period. However, during staff development of the RFP, it became increasingly evident that the new solicitation would not be completed within a time frame that would have allowed for the identification and implementation of capacity building service agreements with new awardees by July 1, 2006.

Current projections indicate that the new solicitation will result in the identification and implementation of agreements with new awardees by November 1, 2006.

Recognizing that the projected start date of new agreements would create a disruption in capacity building services to Department workforce development partners, the Department has requested and received approval from the Office of the State Comptroller to extend

the existing agreements with the Center for Workforce Learning and the New York Association of Training and Employment Professionals for a four month period ending on October 31, 2006.

Parties interested in examining or responding to the Department's solicitation for the next round of capacity building service agreements, scheduled to cover a five year period starting on November 1, 2006, are encouraged to check back in upcoming weeks with this publication for any new information concerning scope of service, eligibility requirements, and due date for responses.
