Tobacco Free Schools Support Programs

Applications will be accepted through February 21, 2007, for the Tobacco Free Schools Support Programs. Funding is available for 11 catchment areas covering parts of New York State, with total available funding of \$1,075,000 per year for this service. This RFA completes the procurement for tobacco free schools support programs (first RFA issued 2004). It is expected that contracts resulting from this RFA will be for the time period December 1, 2007 – November 30, 2009.

Applicants funded for this initiative will work with school districts in their catchment area to develop, implement, and enforce effective tobacco-free school policies. Due to limited resources, partners funded for this service will focus on middle and high schools, unless entire school districts can be engaged. Schools play a key role in creating attitude and behavioral change among students, their families and members of the community. By creating an environment that supports and promotes tobacco-free values and behaviors, schools can be leaders in the fight for tobacco-free lifestyles for children and adults.

This Request for Applications (RFA) is open to any non-profit agency or governmental subdivision in the State of New York serving the catchment areas described. Eligible applicants must have no affiliations or contractual relationships with any tobacco company, its affiliates, its subsidiaries or its parent organization. All applicants must include a statement verifying the vendor's "no tobacco" status.

NOT-FOR-PROFIT AGENCIES Family Support Services Program

The Broome DDSO is announcing the availability of \$138,000 of new funding to provide support services to families that care at home for a family member with a developmental disability. Due to a state-wide recognized growing need, OMRDD has indicated that at least 75% (\$103,500) of the total funding in this RFP be used to help address the needs of individuals with autism or autism spectrum disorder or other similar behavioral disorders. It is also true that needs and priorities may vary from county to county. Therefore, a limited number of proposals (with funding up to \$34,500) serving individuals with other developmental disabilities will be considered. Broome DDSO is seeking proposals from Not-For-Profit agencies to provide services for OMRDD and Family Support Eligible individuals in the counties of Broome, Chenango, Delaware, Otsego, Tioga and Tompkins. The proposals should reflect one or more of the following needs:

Respite – All types (after school, evening, weekend, overnight, reimbursement)

Recreation – Programs that partner between service providers and community organizations

Behavior Management – Programs designed to help families manage challenging behaviors of disabled family members

Inclusion Activities – Programs designed to foster appropriate interactions with the general population

Social Relationship Development – Programs designed to help with age appropriate social skills

Family Training – Programs that focus on providing families with needed skills and resources to meet the need of disabled family members

Advocacy Training/Support – Programs that focus on supporting families as they navigate through State and Federal agencies

A priority is also to address the needs of those who remain unserved and underserved. Small and emerging agencies that provide services to the underserved and the unserved are encouraged to submit proposals. Any proposed service must foster independence, integration, individualization and productivity within the family and community for each person.

Proposals will be accepted if postmarked no later than Friday January 5th, 2007. This "announcement" does NOT supply all of the information necessary to provide a complete response to the RFP.

FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Competitive Grant Program FY 2007

The State Emergency Management Office (SEMO) Mitigation Branch is requesting Letter of Intent (LOI) followed by a detailed project or planning activity application for FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) competitive grant program FY 2007. The funds will be used to support eligible mitigation measures that include planning initiatives and construction activity that will result in protection from future hazards; retrofitting of facilities; property acquisition or relocation; and other types of projects that will result in protection to people and public or private property. Please note: Applicants eligible for project grants include those that have a FEMA-approved and adopted multi-hazard mitigation plan in place by February 5, 2007. The LOI will be accepted through December 8, 2006 and must be submitted by; State level agencies, Federally-recognized Indian Tribal governments, local governments to include county, town, village and cities, state-recognized Indian tribes, and public colleges and universities. Private colleges and universities and non-profit organizations are not eligible sub-applicants; however, eligible sub-applicant such as local governments may apply for assistance on their behalf. Applications will be accepted by FEMA through February 5, 2007, 11:59 p.m. EST., however NYSEMO will establish an application submittal deadline prior to this date, likely early to mid-January 2007 to allow adequate time to review submitted applications. Development, completion and sub-mission of applications will be performed through the FEMA's web-based Mitigation Electronic Grants (eGrants) Management System accessed at the following address: <http://www.fema.gov/government/grant/egrants.shtm>. Once a determination is made that the mitigation activity proposed on the LOI fits eligibility criteria an access ID code will be issued to the applicant and prompted to register on the eGrants system and begin the application process.
