PUBLIC NOTICE

Office of Mental Health

Pursuant to 42 CFR 447.205, the Office of Mental Health hereby gives public notice of the following: The Office of Mental Health is considering the implementation of a Medicaid outpatient reimbursement methodology designed to improve outpatient placement of recent psychiatric inpatient discharges and access to outpatient services for selected groups of persons with serious and persistent mental illness.

This proposal will complement the objectives of the alternative 1990 psychiatric inpatient payment methodology to reduce length of stay and inpatient recidivism for psychiatric inpatient episodes.

The outpatient methodology will provide increased Medicaid outpatient rates of reimbursement to providers who serve inpatient psychiatric patients recently discharged and selected groups of persons with serious and persistent mental illness. The methodology will adjust Medicaid psychiatric outpatient rates or fees and be based only on the volume of Medicaid psychiatric outpatient service.

Needs and Benefits:

The psychiatric inpatient rate methodology approved by the Hospital Review and Planning Council to be effective October 1, 1989 with the first rate adjustment July 1, 1990, provides fiscal incentives to hospitals to reduce length of stay and inpatient recidivism where clinically feasible. Accomplishment of these objectives is partially dependent upon ready

access to community residential and outpatient services for persons prepared for discharge.

A recent study by the Commission on Quality of Care for the Mentally Disabled indicated low rates of placement of psychiatric inpatient discharges into mental health outpatient services. This outpatient methodology will reward those providers of outpatient services, who serve discharges within 30 days of discharge, with higher rates of Medicaid reimbursement.

Similarly, individuals with serious and persistent mental illness are often at risk of hospitalization without ready access to and continuity of care in community services. The methodology provides fiscal incentives to serve two groups of patients who are predominantly persons with severe and persistent mental illness (SPMI), patients discharged in the "Persistent" category under the new inpatient methodology and those receiving intensive case management services.

The semi-annual rate increase will be prospective based on services to the target population in a previous six-month period. The rate increases will provide additional revenue to outpatient providers roughly equivalent to an additional 40% payment for each outpatient visit provided to a recent discharge, and an additional 20% payment for each visit provided to the two selected groups of patients with severe and persistent mental illness. This additional revenue to providers will be exempt from calculations of Office of Mental Health funded state aid.

Costs:

Costs to State government: The estimated maximum increase in the State share of Medicaid as a result of the new methodology is \$1.6 million. For the State FY 90-91 state Medicaid costs will not exceed \$1.2 million (July 1990 - April 1991).

Costs to local government: The maximum local share of Medicaid is estimated to be \$1.35 million for a full year, and \$1 million for State FY 90-91.

Cost to private regulated parties: There is no cost to private regulated parties.

Cost to the regulatory agency for implementation and continued administration of the rule: Negligible.

STATEWIDE — Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84(b), the New York State Department of State (DOS) hereby gives notice that the Federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) concurred on September 7, 1989 on the incorporation of the Town of Smithtown Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) into the State's Coastal Management Program (CMP) as a routine program implementation action.
