Pursuant to 42 CFR Section 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for non-institutional services to reflect recently enacted State Legislation as follows:

Non-Institutional Services

- Supplemental payments of \$4.912 million in aggregate shall be made to certain qualified freestanding diagnostic and treatment centers, for the period October 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003, to reflect additional costs associated with the transition to managed care. This amount is to be paid to qualified providers as defined in paragraph (a) of subdivision two of section 364-j-2 of the Social Service Law per the payment methodology specified in the current approved State plan.
- Supplemental payments in the aggregate of \$112,000 for the period October 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003 shall be made to freestanding facilities, sponsored by a university or dental school, which have been granted an operating certificate under Article 28 of the Public Health Law, and which provide dental services as their principal mission.

The estimated annual aggregate increase in Medicaid expenditures which result from these revisions is approximately \$5.024 million for 2003.

In F-2003-0347, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New York District proposes to perform maintenance dredging of the Federal navigation channel and deposition basin in Fire Island Inlet with subsequent placement of dredged material as beach nourishment along the designated feeder beach (Gilgo) and possibly along Robert Moses State Park beach. In addition, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers proposes to stockpile about 20,000 cubic yards within the designated placement site at Gilgo Beach, for the potential use in a Demonstration Project, which is authorized under Section 227 of Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) 1996 (National Shoreline Erosion control Development and Demonstration Program). The stockpile material, which will be used for the demonstration project to evaluate shore protection measures, will be located approximately 1, 800 feet east of the Old Coast Guard Station, and extend approximately 2,200' in length with a width of approximately 90 .

The maintenance dredging, beach nourishment and stockpile action would require the dredging and placement of approximately 1,220,000 cubic yards of sand from the Fire Island Inlet channel and the adjacent deposition basin. Maintenance dredging and beach nourishment was

last performed in 2001 when a total of approximately 1,610,000 cubic yards of sand was dredged from the inlet and placed as beneficial use and shore protection along Gilgo Beach (1,444,831 cy) and Robert Moses State Park beach (164,794 cy).
