Pursuant to 42 CFR Section 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health proposes to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for Inpatient Hospital Services to clarify the methodology used to develop graduate medical education payments for inpatient hospital services rendered to Medicaid managed care and Family Health Plus enrollees.

Effective December 1, 2003, the average per discharge amount paid for those enrollees that are discharged from the hospital, will be based on the estimated GME reimbursement included in the current rate year's Medicaid inpatient rates of payment for each facility determined on a case mix neutral per discharge basis for both case based payments, including outlier payments, and the exempt unit rate type.

Case based payment rates including outlier payments will be adjusted by each hospital's case mix for Medicaid managed care patients and Family Health Plus patients, using the case mix data reported to the Department for the twelve-month reporting period two years prior to the rate year.

Exempt unit rates will be adjusted by each hospital's exempt unit average length of stay based on the latest available data reported on the Institutional Cost Report for the reporting period two years prior to the rate year.

Hospitals shall submit data to the Department of Health including the actual case mix of each Medicaid managed care and Family Health Plus patient discharged, the final payment amount for services rendered by the hospital and, for exempt units, the actual length of stay.

There is no anticipated increase or decrease in the annual aggregate Medicaid expenditures resulting from this amendment.

Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities

Pursuant to 42 CFR 447.205, the NYS Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities and the NYS Department of Health hereby give notice of the following:

The NYS Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities (OMRDD) proposes to change its methods and standards for setting Medicaid payment fees for Day Treatment facilities serving persons with developmental disabilities. The change will potentially be effective January 1, 2004. The purpose of the change would be to provide an annual adjustment to account for anticipated increases in the operational costs of these facilities. Other than the annual adjustment, OMRDD will use the same reimbursement methodology contained in the most recently promulgated regulations and corresponding State Plan for Day Treatment facilities.

For Day Treatment facilities, the operating component of the fee in effect on the last day of the immediately preceding fee period will be adjusted by a trend factor ranging from zero to five percent. The various fee periods identified in the State Plan for Day Treatment facilities are January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2004, April 1, 2004 through March 31, 2005, and July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005. The potential fiscal impacts of the application of the trend factor for the Day Treatment fee periods beginning January 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2005 would range from no increase to a possible annual aggregate increase of approximately \$13.05 million in funding for these facilities.

STATEWIDE -- Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84, the New York State Department of State (DOS) hereby gives notice that the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) concurred on August 14, 2002 on the incorporation of the City of Newburgh Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) into the State's Coastal Management Program (CMP) as a Routine Program Change. DOS requested OCRM's concurrence on this action on October 4, 2000 in a previous notice in the *State Register* which further described the content of the action.

The Local Waterfront Revitalization Program includes the following new or revised enforceable policies: #1, 2, 4, 7, 8, 9, 11, 13, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 34, 36 and 39. Other changes to the state's enforceable policies based on the LWRP are essentially the same as those found in state law under 19 NYCRR, Part 600.5.

Pursuant to the State CMP and Article 42 of the Executive Law, the City of Newburgh LWRP was adopted by the City on May 14, 2001 and approved by the New York State Secretary of State on August 20, 2001.

Federal consistency with the City of Newburgh LWRP applies as of the date of this notice.

These rates are applicable to the New York State personal income tax (Article 22 of the Tax Law - except for rates of interest payable by or to an employer with respect to income taxes required to be withheld and paid over by the employer pursuant to Part V of such Article 22), unincorporated business income tax (Article 23 of the Tax Law), estate tax (Article 26 of the Tax Law), gift tax (Article 26-A of the Tax Law), generation-skipping transfer tax (Article 26-B of the Tax Law), the New York City resident income tax (Article 30 of the Tax Law, Chapter 17 of the New York City Administrative Code), the New York City nonresident earnings tax (Article 2-E of the General City Law, Chapter 19 of the New York City Administrative Code), the City of Yonkers resident income tax surcharge (Article 30-A of the Tax Law, Article IX of the Codes and Ordinances of the City of Yonkers) and the City of Yonkers nonresident earnings tax (Article 30-B of the Tax Law, Article X of the Codes and Ordinances of the City of Yonkers).

Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (e) of section 1096 of the Tax Law, the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance hereby sets the overpayment rate of interest for the purposes of said subsection for the months of January, February, and March 2004 at 3 percent per annum; and sets the underpayment rate of interest for the purposes of said subsection for the months of January, February and March 2004 at 6 percent per annum. These rates are applicable to the New York State
