In F-2003-0563, the Brockport Yacht Club, 7493 Sandy Harbor Drive, Hamlin, New York 14464 is proposing maintenance activities to preserve the west jetty at the mouth of Sandy Creek in the Town of Hamlin in Monroe County. In order to rebuild the structure, the Brockport Yacht Club is proposing to move rocks currently located adjacent to the jetty onto the top of the jetty. It is estimated that there will be less than 90 yards of rock transferred to the jetty. The replaced rock will compensate for the settling of the center of the jetty over the past 35 years. The work will be done using an excavator mounted on either a barge or on the jetty.

In F-2003-0669, Town of Orleans, P.O. Box 103, LaFargeville, NY 13656, is proposing the expansion of the wastewater collection facilities in the Towns of Orleans and Alexandria. The Towns of Orleans and Alexandria worked together to develop this proposal in response to failing septic tanks and subsurface leach field systems, as well as to eliminate the need for individual SPDES permits and their associated outfalls that currently exist. The proposed project area includes the Town of Orleans Sewer District No. 4 (Hamlet of Fishers Landing), Town of Alexandria Sewer District No. 2 (NYS Route 12) and Town of Clayton (Reed Point Sewer District, "Fishers Landing").

The proposed waste water collection facilities would consist of approximately 6,600 linear feet of 10-inch gravity sewer main, 19,000 linear feet of eight-inch sewer main, 3,950 linear feet of six-inch gravity sewer laterals, 26,255 linear feet of four-inch sewer laterals, 20,100 linear feet of six-inch force main, 6,440 linear feet of 1½ inch pressure sewer, grinder pumps, main lift pump stations and manholes.

The facilities would serve 279 residential properties, 33 commercial properties and one State park. The project site is located along Fishers Landing/NYS Route 12/Collins Landing Road in the Towns of Orleans and Alexandria, Jefferson County.

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The Department of State has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2003-0805, the US Army Corps of Engineers, Environmental Analysis Team, 1776 Niagara Street, Buffalo, NY 14207, proposes to construct a rubble-mound revetment to provide stability to the existing retaining wall and significantly reduce wave run-up along State Route 5 (Lake Shore Road) on the south shore of Lake Erie in the Athol Springs area of the Town of Hamburg in Erie County. The protection would extend for a distance of approximately 860 feet along the shoreline and would extend to an elevation of 587 feet IGLD (International Great Lakes Datum), approximately the top of the existing retaining wall.

Various debris, structural remnants, and sand overburden fronting the retaining wall would be removed and excavated prior to the placement of underlayer and armor stone. The proposed revetment would have a crest width of 5.5 feet and a 1V:2.5H sideslope. The toe stone would be keyed into the shale bedrock to a depth of one-half of the armor stone's diameter. Broken shale excavated at the toe stone would also be removed from the project site. All disturbed soil areas would be treated with topsoil and an appropriate herbaceous seed mixture.

A concrete splash apron would be included along the top of the revetment between its crest and the State Route 5 right-of-way. A two-foot high curb along the landward side of the 15-foot wide apron would minimize further wave overwash onto State Route 5. Amenities such as railings, benches, light standards, and landscaping could be added to this feature to give the apron the added function of serving as a promenade for sightseeing and relaxing.
