F-2003-0233, the New York City Department of Transportation, Division of Bridges, 2 Rector Street, 8th Floor, New York City, NY 10006, is proposing to replace the existing Mill Basin Bridge, a 14-span

bascule bridge with an 11-span, 55' vertical clearance fixed bridge. The existing bridge currently carries three 11'4" (3.454 m) travel lanes and a 6'0" (1.829 m) sidewalk in each direction of the Belt Parkway. A bicycle/pedestrian path is located on the eastern side of both approaches. The bridge provides a 35'0" (10.67 m) minimum vertical clearance over the mean high water (MHW) elevation with the bascule leaves in the down position, and a 131'3" (40 m) wide horizontal navigation channel. The proposed new bridge, which will consist of a precast, prestressed concrete girder-supported reinforced concrete deck slab superstructure, supported by reinforced concrete column piers founded on precast, prestressed concrete piles, would be located approximately 144'0" (44 m) north of the existing alignment. The new bridge would carry three 12'0" (3.6 m) travel lanes and a 4'0" (1.2 m) inside and 12'0" (3.6 m) outside shoulder in each direction of the Belt Parkway. A 12'0" (3.6 m) wide pedestrian/bicycle path would also be placed on the eastbound side. The existing approach would be widened to accommodate the wider roadway. The bridge and approach roadway profiles would be raised to accommodate the 55'0" (16.67 m) minimum clearance over the MHW elevation.

The stream is located adjacent to Fairlawn Avenue and Hylan Boulevard in Staten Island. The proposal includes filling eroded gullies with soil and biogradable fabric, and then replanting the areas with native, shade-tolerant plants. Erosion paths on the park's lawn will be filled with soil

so that the surface runoff will be diverted elsewhere on the lawn, away from the creek which connects to Great Kills Harbor. The proposal also includes repairing an eroded path at both entrances of the Fairlawn Pedestrian Bridge with patches of concrete.

The new bridge, which would consist of continuous steel haunched girders supporting a reinforced concrete deck slab, would carry three 12'0" (3.6 m) travel lanes and a 4'0" (1.2 m) inside and 12'0" (3.6 m) outside shoulder in each direction of the Belt Parkway. A 12'0" (3.6 m) wide pedestrian/bicycle path would also be placed on the eastbound side. The new bridge would have a vertical clearance of 35'0" (10.67 m) over the mean high water (MHW) and a horizontal clearance of 131'3" (40 m).

F-2003-0472, the New York City Department of Transportation, Division of Bridges, 2 Rector Street, 8th Floor, New York City, NY 10006, is proposing to replace the existing Paerdegat Basin Bridge, a 13-span structure consisting of steel stringers and a reinforced concrete deck with a new split bridge. The existing bridge currently carries two 11'0" (3.35 m) travel lanes and one 12'0" (3.6 m) wide travel lane in each direction of the Belt Parkway. A 3'0" (1 m) wide safety walk and an 8'0" (2.4 m) wide bicycle/pedestrian path are located on the north and south sides of the bridge respectively. The existing bridge provides a 28'2" (8.6 m) minimum vertical clearance over the mean high water (MHW) elevation and a 60'0" (18.24 m) wide horizontal navigation channel. For westbound traffic, a new 3-span bridge would be built on the north side of the existing bridge and for eastbound traffic, a new 5-span bridge would be built on the south side of the existing bridge. The substructure would consist of hammerhead piers on concrete pile caps and steel piles, with a superstructure of trapezoidal steel box girders with a reinforced concrete deck slab. The new westbound bridge would be located approximately 74'0" (22.5 m) north of the existing alignment and the new eastbound bridge would be located approximately 154'0" (47 m) south of the existing alignment. The new bridges would carry three 12'0" (3.6 m) travel lanes and a 4'0" (1.2 m) wide inside and 12'0" (3.6 m) wide outside shoulder in each direction of the Belt Parkway. A 12'0" (3.6 m) wide pedestrian/bicycle path would also be placed on the eastbound side. The new bridge would have a vertical clearance of 28'2" (8.6 m) over the mean high water (MHW) and a horizontal clearance of 290'9" (88.7 m).
