AMENDMENT OF RULE Chief Judge's Administrative Delegation

Pursuant to the authority vested in me, I hereby amend, effective January 1, 2004, Administrative Delegation Number 1 of the Chief Judge [22 NYCRR Part 80] to read as follows:

PART 80. ADMINISTRATIVE DELEGATION NUMBER 1 * * *

§ 80.2 Deputy Chief Administrators and Administrative Judges

(a) The Chief Administrator of the Courts, in consultation with the Presiding Justices of the appropriate Appellate Divisions on behalf of their respective courts, and with approval of the Chief Judge, shall designate the following deputy chief administrators and administrative judges, who shall serve at his pleasure for a period not exceeding one year:

(1) in the City of New York: a deputy chief administrator, who may be a judge, for all the trial courts; one administrative judge each for the Family Court, the Civil Court and the Criminal Court; and one administrative judge each for the Supreme Court in Bronx, New York and Queens Counties and the Second Judicial District;

(2) outside the City of New York; a Deputy Chief Administrator, who may be a judge, for all the trial courts; and an Administrative Judge in each judicial district, except that separate Administrative Judges may be designated for Nassau and Suffolk Counties. The Chief Administrator may designate an Administrative Judge or Administrative Judges for the Family Court outside the City of New York; and

(3) such other *deputy chief administrators, administrative judges and supervising judges* as may be required.

Chief Administrator, shall supervise the administration and operation of the trial-level courts and management support functions of the Unified Court System in accordance with and subject to the standards and administrative policies promulgated by the Chief Judge and the policies, rules, orders and directives of the Chief Judge and Chief Administrator.

(c) In exercising this authority, the first deputy chief administrator may exercise and perform any of the powers and duties of the Chief Administrator.

AMENDMENT OF RULE Chief Judge's Administrative Delegation

Pursuant to the authority vested in me, I hereby issue, effective January 1, 2004, the following administrative delegation and add it as Part 82 of the Rules of the Chief Judge:

PART 82. ADMINISTRATIVE DELEGATION NUMBER 3

§ 82.1 Chief Judge's Administrative Delegation Number 3

(a) Pursuant to article VI, section 28(b), of the State Constitution, and further to the delegation of authority to the Chief Administrator of the Courts in Administrative Delegations Numbers 1 and 2 [22 NYCRR Parts 80 and 81], the Chief Administrator of the Courts, in consultation with the Presiding Justices of the Appellate Divisions, and with the approval of the Chief Judge, may designate a first deputy chief administrator for the courts.

(b) The first deputy chief administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the Chief Judge and Chief Administrator and, at the direction of the
