In F-2003-0319, The City of Rochester, % William Price, 30 Church Street, Room 300B, Rochester, NY, 14614-1290, seeks authorization to conduct the proposed Waterfront Redevelopment Project to promote active and passive recreational and assembly type uses along the Genesee River, from Petton Street north to a point approximately 200 feet north of Latta Road. The primary focus of the project involves the stabilization of the shoreline within the project limits. The project would also involve the redevelopment of the waterfront within the project limits for seasonal recreational use.

The shoreline stabilization would be accomplished by excavating a total of 7,110 cubic yards of material from the shoreline. Approximately 6,200 cubic yards of this total is below the high water level. A total of 3,320 cubic yards of stone revetment and 840 cubic yards of embankment material would be placed in the excavated areas. Part of the shoreline stabilization would also involve a 375 feet extension of the existing sheet pile, placed by CSX Railroad, at the northern project limits and 120 feet of new sheet pile at the southern project limits around a proposed boat launch.

The waterfront redevelopment portion of the project will involve the construction of the following amenities:

1. An 11,425 square foot asphalt parking lot at the northern project limits with a 34 space parking capacity.
2. A 54,390 square foot asphalt parking lot and concrete boat launch at the southern project limits with a 119 space parking capacity and a 13 space capacity for boat trailers.
3. The redevelopment of the existing 3,676 square foot Train Depot. A sanitary lateral, electric service and water service would be provided to this building.
4. A 1,500 square foot Transient Boater's Facility. A sanitary lateral, electric service and water service would be provided to this building.
5. A 10,930 square foot timber pier and 8,530 square foot paved boardwalk at Latta Road.
6. A 2,000 foot lighted asphalt walking/bicycle trail from the southern project limits to the southern edge of the timber pier and a 490 foot lighted concrete walking/bicycle trail from the northern edge of the timber pier to the northern project limits.
7. A total of 2, 125 square feet permanent gangways at various points along the waterfront within the project limits. Utilities, such as water and electric, would be provided at each gangway location.
8. The placement or extension of all necessary utilities.

A cargo train derailment in December 2001, resulted in the release of methylene chloride and acetone on the adjacent shoreline, with some of the spilled material entering the River. Excavation would be mechanical, and to a depth of 4 feet below the river bottom with deeper excavation at hot spot locations. A dual turbidity curtain would be installed prior to excavation. Turbidity would be monitored to determine the efficiency of the curtains. A post-

excavation sediment sampling program will also be employed. The duration of dredging activities is estimated to be less than or equal to 32 business days. Sediments would be transported periodically to the impervious processing/stockpile area on shore and managed in this area to contain the sediments and any associated runoff. Sediments would be processed so that they pass a paint-filter test and/or penetration test for transport. Processed sediments would then be sampled prior to transport to one of three landfills as determined by sample analytical results. The site is located adjacent to River Street in the City of Rochester, Monroe County. The area in which the acetone and methylene chloride were released is approximately one mile upstream from the mouth of the Genesee River.
