An additional Legislative Public Hearing will be held on the draft Hazardous Waste Facility Siting Plan (Siting Plan) and the supporting draft generic EIS on March 16, 2004 and the public comment period has been extended to April 19, 2004.

Purpose: The Siting Plan is to be used as guidance by any hazardous waste facility siting board reviewing proposals for siting certain new or expanded hazardous waste management facilities within New York State and for Department and other State government agencies to use to assure the availability of sufficient hazardous waste facility capacity.

The hearing location is reasonably accessible to the mobility-impaired. Interpreter services can be made available to the hearing-impaired at no charge, upon request to the Department within a reasonable time period prior to the hearing.

All persons, organizations, corporations or government agencies, etc., which may be affected by the proposed Siting Plan are invited to attend the hearing and to submit either written or oral statements. The hearing session will continue until all persons wishing to make statements have been heard. Reasonable time limits may be set for each speaker to afford everyone an opportunity to be heard. Lengthy statements should be submitted in writing and summarized for oral presentation. Written statements received prior to the close of the public comment period and oral statements made at each hearing session will be given equal weight.

**F-2003-0214, the New York City Department of Transportation (DOT), of 40 Worth Street, Rm. 1124, New York, NY 11101,** proposes to construct and operate a new asphalt plant on a parcel that is leased from New York City. The parcel is located at 32-11 Harper Street, Queens, New York. The parcel is approximately 5.4 acres in area and is currently occupied by DOT for use as the Queens vehicle maintenance and repair facility. Under agreement with New York City Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR), the DOT has been utilizing an adjacent 1.1-acre parcel to the west. Collectively, the 5.4-acre DOT yard, and the 1.1-acre DPR property would comprise the Harper Street Yard Asphalt Plant project. The DOT yard is located in Queens County, and is bounded by the Flushing Creek to the north, Northern Boulevard to the south, the elevated Whitestone Expressway, and its right-of-way to the east, and Harper Street and the DPR property to the west. Flushing Creek bounds the DPR property further to the west. The scope of the project is to design, construct, and operate a new asphalt plant at the DOT yard in order to replace the existing asphalt plant that had been in operation at the Site from the late 1930's to the 1970's. The staged development will include the demolition of designated structures on the site and the following improvements:

- Developments of an asphalt plant, including all required equipment, utilities, site improvements and asphalt manufacturing

apparatus, and a support building for the operation and management of the facility. The proposed asphalt plant will consist of processing equipment, stockpiles of aggregate and recycled asphalt, tanks for asphaltic cement, mixing and handling equipment, scales and a control/Support Building. The building, equipment and tanks will be supported on concrete filled steel pipe piles.

- Rehabilitation of the shoreline bulkhead, with associated dredging of Flushing Creek to accommodate barges and tugboats supplying aggregate to the proposed asphalt plant.
- New storm and sanitary sewer systems at the DOT yard including the construction of stormwater catch basins, an oil/water separator, a new packaged sewage treatment plant with new outfalls to Flushing Creek.
- Shoreline modifications on the DPR property including the installation of a riprap seawall along with associated upland and wetland plantings.
- A new stormwater system on the DPR property including the construction of stormwater catch basins and an oil/water separator with a new outfall to Flushing Creek.

**In F-2003-0539, Robert Frank of 984 Glen Edyth Way, Webster, New York,** is proposing to install sheetpile riprap to stabilize portions of the shoreline of the Island of Glen Edyth Bay. The proposed activity includes replacing an existing timber wall with 70 linear feet of vinyl sheetpile to a top elevation of 246.0. Riprap will be placed over geosynthetic filter fabric and medium stone fill. The riprap will be placed in three separate locations along the island's shoreline. Approximately 2,030 cubic feet of riprap will be placed along the northerly shoreline with the fill beginning above the low water elevation and extending landward approximately 10 to 12 feet horizontally. Approximately 615 cubic feet will be placed along the southwest edge; and 900 cubic feet will be placed along the southeast edge. Directional boring will be used for the installation of utility services including water, electricity, telephone, and gas which will be extended from the mainland. Two separate receiving pits will be dug to accept the utilities. A 20' by 35'

area at the eastern side of the island will be used as a staging area for the directional boring equipment. All spoil from the drilling operation will be removed off-site. Two 7-foot diameter circular areas on the southern tip of the island are to be used as leaching chambers. A 4' wide seasonal floating dock and ramp will extend 50' waterward from the island at the northeast edge of the island. Steel supports will be driven as needed to install the dock.

**In F-2003-0555, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation (NMPC), of 300 Erie Blvd. West, Syracuse, NY 13202,** proposes to construct a new 345 kilovolt transmission line from the proposed Besicorp-Empire Development Company, LLC (BEDCO) cogeneration power plant in the City of Rensselaer to the NMPC Reynolds Road Substation in the Town of North Greenbush, Rensselaer County. The BEDCO Power Plant is a proposed nominal 505-megawatt cogeneration power facility that will provide steam and electricity to the adjoining Recycled New print Manufacturing Plant (RNMP) as well as deliver power to the NMPC bulk electric transmission grid.

The proposed transmission line would follow existing rights-of-way (ROWs). NMPC holds most of the necessary property rights along the alignment of the proposed transmission line including fee interest, easements, and licenses. The Proposed Transmission Line would connect the BEDCO Power Plant to the existing 345 kV NMPC Reynolds Road substation in the adjoining Town of North Greenbush. The alignment of the proposed transmission line travels from the City of Rensselaer through the Town of East Greenbush before entering the Town of North Greenbush. The Towns of East Greenbush and North Greenbush are also located in Rensselaer County.

The proposed transmission line route starts at the proposed BEDCO Power Plant in the City of Rensselaer and travels south along the existing 100-foot wide NMPC ROW into the Town of East Greenbush to an intersection with an additional NMPC ROW, a distance of approximately 1.7 miles. This segment would be placed on double circuit steel monopole structures within the existing ROW, approximately 140-160 feet in height. The proposed transmission line route then follows an

existing NMPC ROW in a northeasterly direction for approximately 2.3 miles, where it will be constructed on a new set of single circuit steel monopoles located on the northerly side of the ROW, approximately 112-160 feet in height. The proposed line would then continue approximately 4.1 miles in a northerly direction following an existing NMPC ROW, and terminate at the NMPC Reynolds Road substation. The proposed transmission line would be constructed along the western side of this combined 355 foot wide ROW. The line would be constructed on a new set of single circuit steel monopoles located on the western side of the ROW, approximately 112-160 feet in height

**F-2003-0556, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation (NMPC), of 300 Erie Blvd. West, Syracuse, NY 13202,** proposes to construct a new 4.5 mile, 16-inch diameter, natural gas transmission pipeline from Tennessee Gas Pipeline's (TGP) transmission line No. 200 in the Town of Schodack to the Empire State Newsprint Projects (ESNP) in the City of Rensselaer. Facilities would be located almost entirely within an existing state highway corridor. The stated purpose is to supply natural gas to the proposed Besicorp-Empire Development Company, LLC (BEDCO) 505-megawatt combined-cycle Co-generation Power Plant to be built in the City of Rensselaer, Rensselaer County, New York. BEDCO is proposing, separately, the construction of the Empire State Newsprint Projects which would include a Recycled Newsprint Manufacturing Plant (RNMP) and the BEDCO Power Plant. The BEDCO Power Plant would supply steam and electricity to the RNMP and produce electricity for sale into the wholesale market.

NMPC would construct a new gate station to the north of TGP's No. 200 pipeline on the eastern side of Route 9J. In addition to the proposed E-37 Natural Gas Pipeline that will exit the new gate station to the north, NMPC would construct the pipeline from the new gate station to connect to the No. 200 pipeline. From the new gate station, the proposed E-37 Natural Gas Pipeline proceeds along to the eastern edge of the Route 9J right-of-way. The facility would head north, paralleling Route 9J to the East Greenbush town line. The route through the Town of Schodack requires the crossing of 2 Class C streams. The Papscannee Marsh and

Creek/Papscanee Island Nature Preserve is located to the west of the Route 9J right-of-way and will be avoided by the Facility. From the Schodack/East Greenbush municipal boundary, the proposed E-37 Natural Gas Pipeline route continues along the eastern edge of the Route 9J right-of-way. The approximately 2.7 mile route segment in East Greenbush crosses 3 Class C streams. The Papscanee is located between the western edge of Route 9J and the Hudson River along much of this segment of the route. The route continues along the eastern edge of the Route 9J right-of-way, and turns west a few hundred feet south of the Rensselaer City line, passing under Route 9J and a CSX rail line. The proposed pipeline would then follow a new easement north, crossing private properties, to the BEDCO Power Plant site, where it would terminate at a new gas large meter station in the central portion of the BEDCO Power Plant site.

Phase I included the repair and replacement of existing, functioning shoreline structures and infrastructure and street development. Phase II includes: street and infrastructure development; a pedestrian/vehicular bridge; the reconstruction and new construction of bulkhead; a marina, breakwater, ice breakers and fishing pier; and the redevelopment of the rip-rap (revetment) along approximately 700 linear feet of shoreline.

The in-water activities proposed for Phase II include: (1) construction of a pedestrian/vehicular bridge over the Saw Mill River Outlet Cove along with a deck for pedestrian access from the bridge to the new entrance of the Metro-North Railroad station; (2) rehabilitation of the shoreline by replacing/restoring the bulkhead in the form of steel or rip-rap (revetment); (3) construction of a roadway and continual pedestrian boardwalk along the Hudson River over a small cove; (4) replacement-in-kind of the concrete deck, which is currently supported by timber piles and fill, adjacent to the small cove at a footprint that is smaller than the existing footprint; (5) replacement-in-kind of an asphalt-surfaced deck that is currently supported by timber piles; (6) construction of a recreational and transient marina containing 152 boat slips, ice breakers and a breakwater; and (7) construction of a fishing pier that will also serve as the northern portion of the breakwater system to minimize the footprint of new over-water structures. In addition, the construction of a drainage system consisting of two new 36-inch diameter stormwater outfalls and two new 24-inch diameter stormwater outfalls to discharge runoff from the site to the Hudson River.

The pedestrian/vehicular bridge, roadway, and pedestrian deck are designed to provide access to the waterfront and a continual pedestrian boardwalk along the Hudson River. The bulkhead maintenance/construction is required to restore/replace non-functioning deteriorating shoreline structures. The marina and fishing pier are proposed to provide recreational use of the Yonkers waterfront area. The breakwater surrounding the marina is required for the protection of the marina and shoreline from waves and wakes from passing boats. The construction of six (6) triangular ice breakers are proposed on the north side of the marina to protect the marina from flowing ice in the winter.

In-water construction activities would include driving piles for various components of the project; the placement/replacement of bulkhead; the replacement-in-kind of a concrete and asphalt-surfaced deck; and the placement of approximately 23.3 cubic yards (CY) of clean fill below the Mean High Water (MHW) level and 108.7 CY of clean fill above the MHW level.

A hydraulic excavator with open bucket will be used to dredge the site. As the dredge spoil is clean sand, no dewatering is anticipated. Hay bales and filter fabrics will be placed around the catch basins.
