The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The US Army Corps of Engineers has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2004-0534, The US Army Corps of Engineers, New York District, Jacob K. Javits Federal Building, New York, NY 10278-0090, proposes to perform maintenance dredging of the Federal navigation channel and deposition basin in Lake Montauk Harbor with placement of the dredged material as shore protection along the designated beach shoreline west of the west jetty. The maintenance dredging action would require the removal of approximately 22,000 cubic yards of sand from the Lake Montauk Harbor channel and the adjacent deposition basin. Maintenance dredging was last performed in 2000 and a total of 50,000 cubic yards was removed and placed as shore protection along the beach shoreline. Maintenance dredging of the channel and deposition basin at Lake Montauk Harbor would be accomplished by pipeline dredge, hopper dredge or similar plant. The entire channel would not generally require maintenance dredging; only areas where shoaling has reduced the depth of the channel would require dredging. No work would occur during the environmental widows for roseate tern and piping plovers (April 1 to September 30), and for egg and larval stages of finfish and shellfish (January 1 to September 30).

comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., **15 days from the date of publication of this notice, or August 12, 2004.**
