The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The U.S. Border Patrol has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, NY.

In F-2004-0447, the U.S. Border Patrol is proposing the construction and operation of 12 remote surveillance systems along the Upper Niagara River. All sites are situated along the Niagara River and would consist of 10 remote video systems, two microwave repeater sites and one control and monitoring station.
