## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Department of Environmental Conservation

Notice is hereby given that the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (Department), is initiating an additional 30 day public comment period, and an additional public hearing on the following proposed revision to the State Implementation Plan (SIP): Onondaga County Carbon Monoxide Maintenance Plan for 2003 - 2013.

The purpose of the SIP revision is to demonstrate how the Carbon Monoxide (CO) National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) will be maintained in Onondaga County for an additional 10-year period (2003-2013) past the initial maintenance period as required by Section 175A of the Clean Air Act. This demonstration shows that the CO emissions inventory for Onondaga County will decrease during these years, and that control of CO emissions will be provided through continued implementation of the control measures in the County.

A previous comment period was held regarding this maintenance plan which resulted in two modifications to that document: 1. The initial proposed revision demonstrated maintenance of the CONAAQS through 2015. Following consultation with the United States Environmental Protection Agency, this was determined to be in excess of the 10 years required. The document was revised to reflect a 10-year

period of 2003-2013; and, 2. Local transportation agencies commented that the Department's prediction for the future amount of vehicle miles traveled (VMT) in the county was lower than their estimations, resulting in a prediction of motor vehicle emissions that was too low. Consequently, the motor vehicles emission budget for future years has been increased. This action has not impacted the County's ability to maintain the CO NAAQS.

At the hearing, persons who wish to make a statement will be invited to speak. It is requested that oral statements also be submitted in writing. The Department will give equal weight to written and oral statements, and since a cumulative record will be compiled, it is not necessary for interested parties to attend the hearing.
