NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING LEGAL ASSISTANCE AND TRAINING TO PERSONS LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS

Grants for the provision of legal services and training or legal issues

Recipients of these funds for Component A will include not-for-profit organizations that currently provide legal services within New York State, such as community-based organizations and academic institutions that provide such services through law school clinics, and under Component B include not-for-profit organizations with relevant HIV legal training experience that currently provide services within New York State.

Applications will be accepted through July 19, 2004 to support six grants of \$75,000 each for the provision of general legal services for persons living with HIV/AIDS (under Component A); and to support one grant of \$90,000 for the provision of training and technical assistance on legal issues for AIDS service providers (under Component B).

Contracts will be awarded for a period of 12 months, starting on January 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005, and may be renewed based on satisfactory performance and availability of funds.

Single Room Occupancy Support Services Program (SRO)

Applications will be accepted through June 10, 2004. The New

York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) will issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Single Room Occupancy Support Services Program (SRO) in the Spring of 2004. Funds available under this program are subject to the passage of the SFY 2004-2005 Aid to Localities Budget.

The Single Room Occupancy Support Services Program (SRO) was enacted by the legislature in August 1987, pursuant to Title 2, Article 2-A of the Social Services Law in order to provide appropriate support services to single adults living in SRO's and to assist them in living independently. The support services provided under this program include a range of social services, daily living skills assistance, and informational services which foster independent living and which cannot be funded by other existing state and local funding streams. Eligible applicants for funding are social services districts or not-for-profit corporations including charitable and faith based organizations incorporated or organized in the State of New York.

Social services districts that receive funds under this program will be required to match them on a dollar-for-dollar basis through direct grants to the non-profit recipients. However, where the Commissioner of OTDA determines that direct local district participation is not possible, districts may substitute actual or in-kind expenditures by eligible not-for-profit/charitable organizations. Eligible not-for-profit/charitable organizations receiving grants directly from the state must match State funds with actual or in-kind expenditures financed from other sources.

Emergency Shelter Grants Program (ESGP)

Applications will be accepted through May 25, 2004. The New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) has issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the ESGP in the Spring of 2004. Approximately \$3,000,000 in Federal funds have been made

available to the State from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act (P.L. 100-77). These funds will be used to improve the quality of and the quantity of emergency shelters for the homeless and to conduct homeless prevention activities.

Funds allocated to New York State by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will be awarded to local social services districts, charitable organizations and not-for profit corporations through this competitive RFP process. A social services district may either manage the grant itself or distribute its grant (or a portion thereof) through sub-contracts with a not-for-profit or charitable organizations providing emergency shelter and services to homeless individuals and families. Not-for-profit and charitable organizations applying directly to OTDA for funding under this program must provide certification that the social services district in which the project is located approves the project.
