**In F-2004-0310 (DA), the US Army Corps of Engineers, Jacob K Javits Federal Building, New York, NY 10278,** seeks authorization to perform maintenance dredging of the outer entrance channel, from Mile 0 to Mile 1.87 of the Jamaica Bay Federal Navigation Project. This channel was last dredged in 2002 with the removal of 366,000 cubic yards of sediment. The proposed maintenance dredging would involve the removal of approximately 300,000 cubic yards of material. The dredging would be accomplished by pipeline dredge, hopper dredge, or similar plan. The entire channel would generally not require maintenance dredging; dredging would be confined to those areas where shoaling has reduced the depth of the channel. No work would occur during the environmental windows for roseate terns and piping plovers (April 1 to September 15.) The dredged material would be stockpiled on an old runway at Floyd Bennet Field, part of the National Park Service's Gateway National Recreation Area. The stockpile location has been coordinated with the National Park Service and would avoid the runway area utilized by the model airplane club. The purpose of the proposed dredging is to maintain the authorized project dimensions, thereby assuring safe and economical use of the Jamaica Bay by shipping interests. The proposed project site is located in Rockaway Inlet, in Rockaway Point, NY.
