The draft Request for Proposals shall be subject to a sixty-day comment period. Such comments must be received at the office of the Islip Resource Recovery Agency, 401 Main St., Islip, New York no later than 4:30 p.m. prevailing time on Tuesday, November 30th, 2004.

The final RFP will be available at the IRRA office, 401 Main Street, Islip, NY on Thursday, December 9, 2004.

The final proposal submission must be returned to the IRRA office on Wednesday, December 22, 2004 no later than 4:00 p.m.

There will be a mandatory pre-proposal conference and site meeting held on, Thursday, December 9, 2004, 10:00 a.m. at the MacArthur Resource Recovery Facility (4001 Veterans Memorial Highway, Ronkonkoma, New York 11779).

A charge of \$100.00, in the form of a Certified Check or Money Order, made payable to the Islip Resource Recovery Agency, will be required for each set of Information for Proposers, Form of Proposal, Form of Contract, Plans and Detailed Specifications. All proposers and non-proposers returning such set in good condition within 30 days after the date of receipt of bids, will be refunded the sum of \$100.00.

Each proposal must be accompanied by either a Certified Check on a solvent bank or Trust Company acceptable to the IRRRA, or by a bid bond from a surety prepared in such form as is acceptable to the IRRRA. The Certified Check or bid bond shall be in the amount of 10% of the total proposal price and be made payable to the Islip Resource Recovery Agency as assurance that the Contract will be executed, if awarded to such proposer.

In F-2004-0330, The NYS Canal Corporation, 200 Southern Blvd., P.O. Box 189, Albany, NY, is seeking authorization to perform annual maintenance dredging activities in the New York State Barge Canal between the City of North Tonawanda, Niagra County, and the Town of Waterford, Saratoga County. The Canal Corporation's existing Department of Army permit expires on June 4, 2004. The proposed activities include mechanical and hydraulic dredging of navigation channels located within the Canal, and disposal of dredged material into designated Upland Disposal Sites (UDS). Note that the return water from the UDS is authorized under Nationwide Permit 16, and included in the NYSDEC 201 Water Quality Certification (#0-9999-00031/00011). Only one proposed dredge site is located within the NYS Coastal zone: dredge site # 7-47-7E. This site is located in the Erie Canal where the Tonawanda Creek meets the

Niagara River in the City of North Tonawanda, Niagara County. The applicant proposes to dredge 20,000 cubic yards via mechanical dredging from the site, and dispose of the material at UDS 7-12, which is located adjacent to the Amherst Veterans Canal Park, and the Tonawanda Creek.

Dredging operations would take place just north of the existing channel and would remove approximately 193+/- cubic yards via hydraulic excavator. Wetland areas marked by flags would be avoided, as would areas of high fiddler crab concentrations, and a silt curtain would be placed at the mouth of the lagoon to prevent re-suspended sediment from reaching Manhasset Bay. Compatible soils from the dredging operations would be used to nourish the east beach above mean high water; non-compatible soils would be transported via truck to the lot above the lagoon. The applicant also proposes the installation of an 18" plastic corrugated pipe to flush the rest of the lagoon. The pipe would be submerged to a depth of 18", so that water may flow into and out of the lagoon. The proposed project is located at Kennilwood Lagoon off of Manhasset Bay, in Kings Point, Town of North Hempstead, Nassau County.

In F-2004-0775 (DA) , The United States Coast Guard, 300 Metro Center Boulevard, Warwick, RI, 02886, proposes to conduct a maintenance dredging project at US Coast Guard Station Jones Beach located in Freeport, adjacent to Jones Beach State park. Station Jones Beach is located on Sloop Channel off Hempstead Bay near Jones Inlet on the south shore of Long Island. Approximately 4,500 cubic yards of material would be removed in order to return the shallow areas to their previous 8 foot depth. It has been necessary to conduct this maintenance dredging approximately every 5 years in order to ensure operational capability of the station's patrol boats. The 4,500 cubic yards of dredged material would be hydraulically dredged and pumped directly to a bermed area west of the boat basin, which was previously used for storage of dredged materials. Return flow would pass over a weir structure prior to entering an existing culvert and returning to the waterway.
