Pursuant to 42 CFR § 447.205, the Department of Health hereby gives public notice of the following:

The Department of Health ("the Department") proposes to amend the Title XIX Medicaid State Plan to supplement the amount paid by the Medicaid program to ambulance providers. Effective April 1, 2005, an annual "emergency medical transportation service supplemental medical assistance payment" shall be made quarterly to ambulance providers in an aggregate amount based upon fiscal year data.

For each ambulance provider that receives medical assistance payments, the Department shall determine the ratio of such provider's payments to the total such payments made during each quarter of the calendar year, expressed as a percentage. The Department shall multiply the percentage of medical assistance payments made to each ambulance provider by the aggregate amount. The result of such calculation shall represent the "emergency medical transportation service supplemental payment" and shall be paid expeditiously to such provider on a quarterly basis.

The Department shall pay one hundred per centum of the non-federal share of any payments made as a result of this amendment to the State Plan. The Department will maintain a cumulative total of aggregate payments made to providers. When those payments reach one-quarter of the aggregate total in any one social services district, no additional payments will be made during that fiscal year to providers whose place of business is within that social services district.

The aggregate amount will be four million dollars annually statewide. The total amount paid to providers, whose place of business is within any one social services district, cannot exceed one million dollars annually. If the State cannot secure federal participation, the aggregate amount will be two million dollars annually statewide. In this case, the total amount paid to providers, whose place of business is within any one social services district, cannot exceed \$500,000 annually.

The supplemental payments will result in an annual cost of up to \$4.0 million to the State's Medicaid Program.

The National Park Service has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2005-0216 (DA), The National Park Service is proposing to rehabilitate the existing Sailors Haven Marina and ferry dock by repairing damaged portions of the marina, including bulkheads, decks, breakwaters, docks, piers, moorings, and their substructures; stabilizing the structures against future damage and deterioration; correcting deficiencies in the existing ferry dock to make it stable, operational, and safe for public use; dredging materials including the dredging of the 1,000-foot access channel into Sailors Haven; and otherwise making improvements to boaters' navigation in, and the functional use of, the marina. The primary purpose of this project is to allow for continued visitor access, and to improve visitor safety and experience. A secondary purpose is to provide protection to bay beaches by providing for centralized visitor access to the island, thereby avoiding diffuse access impacts to bay beaches and vegetation. Additional protection to bay beaches and vegetation would be provided through stabilization of the shoreline on either side of the marina where erosion has occurred during the past decade.
