## Office of Children and Family Services Administrative Adjudication Report Division of Legal Affairs Bureau of Special Fair Hearings

Pursuant to Executive Order No.131 issued on December 4, 1989, each agency is required to publish a report that sets forth the steps taken by the agency to comply with the Order. The report of the former Department of Social Services, an Office of Children and Family Services' predecessor agency, detailed the initial steps taken to comply with the Order, including changes in organizational structure, office regulations and practices and in hearing procedures. ## PUBLIC NOTICE Department of State Routine Program Change Notice

PURSUANT to 15 CFR 923.84(b), the New York State Department of State (DOS) has submitted a routine program change to the federal

Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM). The DOS considers this action to be routine and requests OCRM's concurrence in this determination. The change to the New York State Coastal Management Program (CMP) covered by this request is the incorporation of the Town of Somerset Local Waterfront Revitalization Program into the State's CMP.

A major component of the State's CMP is the provision that local governments be allowed to prepare local waterfront revitalization programs which further detail and make geographically specific the State's coastal policies. Each local program will be reviewed for consistency with the State's CMP and approved if it meets the guidelines established in the State CMP and Article 42 of the NYS Executive Law.

The Somerset Local Waterfront Revitalization Program will serve as a long term management program for the Town's Lake Ontario waterfront resources. The program focuses on expanding public access opportunities and protection of sensitive coastal resources.

2005-0202 Matter of Brett and Domenica Holleran, 14 Spring Street, Oneonta, NY 13820 for a variance concerning a fire-safety requirement for installation of sprinkler systems.

Involved is new construction of 20 Group R-1 (residential-transient) occupancies each in a proposed building of type VB-combustible construction, one story in height, and approximately 235 square feet in gross floor area. To be known as the "Deer Haven Campground", it will be located at the north side of Chestnut Street at NYS Route 205, Town of Oneonta, Otsego County, State of New York.
