Mobile Mammography Initiative

This Request For Applications (RFA) will support the operation of mobile mammography programs in NYS. The desired outcome of this initiative is to establish contracts of a three-year duration with mobile mammography providers that are or are willing to become participants in local Healthy Women Partnerships.

A total of \$450,000 is available for this project annually. Awards for each grant will be up to \$50,000 per year. It is expected that this initiative will become effective April 1, 2006 and continue through March 31, 2009. Current plans are to issue approximately nine awards. Preference will be given to applicants serving counties that are under capacity for mammography, defined as at or below 74% of capacity for female residents aged 40 and older.

ORGANIZATIONS INTERESTED IN IMPLEMENTING ARTHRITIS INTERVENTION PROGRAM

Arthritis Self Help Course, People with Arthritis Can Exercise, Arthritis Foundation Aquatics Program

The New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) Arthritis and Disability and Health Programs and Health Research, Inc. (HRI) are seeking organizations interested in implementing arthritis intervention programs for persons with arthritis and related diseases. During the last several years, both programs have offered funding opportunities for community organizations to implement interventions. We are interested in applications from organizations that have not been funded through this program in the past. Previous awardees are eligible to apply, however, greater weight will be given to new applicants.

Funding is provided by Centers for Disease Control and is administered by HRI. Awardees will be expected to sign a contract with HRI. Attached is a copy of the boilerplate contract. The arthritis interventions are the 6-week Arthritis Self Help Course (ASHC), People with Arthritis Can Exercise (PACE), and the Arthritis Foundation Aquatics Program (AFAP). All three programs are proven interventions in the management of arthritis and related diseases. We anticipate that up to eleven applications will be funded. At least three of these awards will fund disability service or advocacy organizations. Maximum funding for each grantee is \$4,000. New York State not-for-profit community service providers are invited to apply, such as disability service or advocacy organizations, Independent Living Centers, rural health care networks, Area Agencies on Aging, and others who serve people with disabilities and/or arthritis. The Department of Health reserves the right to award grants based on geographic or regional considerations to serve the best interest of the state.
