The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New York District has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2005-0616 (DA), The U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, New York District (the District) is proposing the utilization of dredged materials from Rockaway Inlet and Ambrose Channel to improve and restore tidal wetland habitat in interior portions of Jamaica Bay, City of New York, Kings County. The project has been developed as a cooperative effort between the District, National Park Service - Gateway National Recreation Area, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, New York City Department of Environmental Protection, and the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey.

The project proposes the placement of 315,000 cubic yards of sand on Elders Point (East and West) and the planting of 61 acres of low marsh vegetation to re-establish the low marsh habitat, generally ranging in elevation between +1 ft. to +2.25 ft. NAVD. The project is intended to increase total marsh habitat by 70 acres.

The project will reslurry the stockpiled material and hydraulically pump the material to Elders Point. This requires the intake of water from Jamaica Bay as a source for reslurrying the material. Geotubes would be placed along the perimeter of the marsh to act as a containment system for the placed material, and the placed material will be regraded to achieve the desired elevation and configuration. After the final regrading of the area, the marsh will be planted with a combination of smooth cordgrass (*Spartina alterniflora*), salt meadow hay (*Spartina patens*), and spike grass (*Distichlis spicata*) grown from seed collected in the bay in September 2005. Construction for the Marsh Islands project is scheduled to begin in January 2006, and the planting of the low marsh vegetation prior to June 30, 2006.
