## **Safe Drinking Water Act Grant Program**

Applications will be accepted through February 28, 2005. All projects must meet the primary goal, to protect and enhance the quality or quantity of the New York City water supply, while preserving and enhancing the economic and social character of the communities in the New York City (NYC) Watershed. Project Types that will be considered under this funding source:

1. Non-Point Source Abatement and Control
2. Assessment, Planning and Research
3. Outreach and Education

It is anticipated that \$1.0 million will be available to fund selected projects in the fiscal year 2005 Grant Program. The source of funding is from the federal Safe Drinking Water Act Grant Program. In addition, projects may be funded from the enacted state budget for State Fiscal Year 2005-6.

## **Promising Tobacco Control Interventions**

Applications will be accepted through April 8, 2005 for Promising Tobacco Control Interventions. Applicants may apply for funding in the amount of \$50,000 to \$150,000 per intervention per year for one, two, or three years. Approximately \$1.5M per year is available.

The Tobacco Control program is seeking applications for projects that will demonstrate the effectiveness of promising, but not yet established, tobacco control interventions. Funded programs will demonstrate the effectiveness of promising tobacco interventions that have not yet been recommended as evidence-based in the tobacco control literature. Funded applications will include documentation of the current evidence in support of the likelihood of project success, a

strong evaluation component, and plans to publish evaluation results in the peer reviewed scientific literature.

This Request for Applications (RFA) is open to all non-profit organizations in New York State as well as governmental subdivisions. Applicants must have experience in managing public health programs, though not necessarily programs funded by the Department. Applicants must be able to manage and implement the interventions proposed in their application with minimal technical assistance from the Department. Eligible applicants must have no affiliations or contractual relationships with any tobacco company, its affiliates, its subsidiaries or its parent organization. All applicants must include a statement verifying the vendor's "no tobacco" status.

## **Project WAVE New York**

Eligible applicants include not-for-profit HIV/AIDS service providers that are Project WAVE New York member agencies AND have participated as lead agencies for Project WAVE New York events. Applicants should have demonstrated ability to successfully organize Project WAVE and other community-based HIV prevention events and activities targeting communities of color, including areas of project management described in Section IV, Scope of Work/Responsibilities. The successful applicant will ideally also have demonstrated experience working with subcontractors or consultants.

Applications will be accepted until 4:00 PM on March 23, 2005 in response to a Request for Applications (RFA) to carry out the statewide operations related to the continuation of Project WAVE New York. Project WAVE is a collaborative effort among Project WAVE, Inc., the state and local health departments, HIV/AIDS service providers and minority radio stations, to raise awareness about risks for HIV/AIDS in communities of color and to encourage individuals to know their HIV status by getting tested and getting into care.

The selected contractor will be expected to provide one dedicated full time staff member to manage all aspects of Project WAVE activities including, but not limited to, coordinating Project WAVE outreach, counseling and testing events statewide; subcontracting with Project WAVE, Inc. to negotiate the purchase of radio remotes and publicity with minority radio stations and other appropriate media to reach the target populations (communities of color); negotiating the purchase of

incentives for pre- and post-test counseling and managing all aspects of distribution, storage and record keeping for incentives; securing venue space for Project WAVE events and handing associated rental fees; handling the printing, storage and distribution of Project WAVE promotional materials; and collecting data for all Project WAVE events and submitting it to the AIDS Institute on a timely basis.

Up to \$125,000 is available for one contractor to support the activities related to this RFA. This RFA is limited to the management and oversight of Project WAVE New York. Materials and consultant expenses are predetermined and beyond the scope of this RFA; additional funding will be provided to cover these and other program expenses.
