Prevention of Type 2 Diabetes in Children

The purpose of this initiative is to fund the implementation of evidence-based interventions for the prevention of type 2 diabetes in children residing in high-risk communities in New York State. Up to eight projects will be funded with contract terms from October 1, 2005 – March 31, 2010.

Applications will be accepted through April 15, 2005. Eligible applicants for this RFA include public and private not-for-profit organizations. Those that may apply include hospitals, schools, school districts, community health centers, community centers/organizations, faith-based organizations/programs, county health departments, and voluntary organizations. It is expected that applicants will be able to demonstrate extensive community collaboration, especially with other chronic disease programs, local health units, local business groups, pre-schools, schools, after-school programs, youth-based organizations, or healthcare providers.
