## PARTNERSHIP OF AN ENGINEERING, MATHEMATICS, OR SCIENCE DEPARTMENT OF AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND A HIGH-NEED LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCY **Title II Part B Mathematics and Science Partnerships, No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB)**

Approximately \$11.5 million is available to support existing three-year grants under the Mathematics and Science Partnership Program. The purpose of this program is to increase academic achievement of students in mathematics and science by enhancing the content knowledge and teaching skills of classroom teachers. Partnerships between high-need school districts and the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) faculty in institutions of higher education are at the core of these improvement efforts.

A grantee must be a partnership that includes a high-need local educational agency and an engineering, mathematics, or science department of an institution of higher education. Other agencies such as other local educational agencies, public charter schools, private schools, businesses, and others may also be included in the partnership.

All funds will be used to support existing three-year grants.

**Delivery of 14-Carat Curriculum Training**

The New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH) announces the availability of funds for the delivery of training on the 14-CARAT curriculum, an OMH copyrighted curriculum that is required for staff providing Intensive In-Home Services to children and adolescents and their families enrolled in the Home and Community Based Services Waiver (HCBSW) program and for staff providing Home Based Crisis Intervention services (HBCI). Funding is available to provide the three-day curriculum in all of the five OMH regions of the state. The contract will be for (5) years, renewed annually.

Eligible applicants are not-for-profit agencies with (501(c)(3)) incorporation that are currently licensed to operate a children's mental health program and/or children's residential program as well as all HCBS Waiver providers. Current licensed providers who apply must have operating certificates in good standing with OMH. Additionally, eligible applicants must have staff dedicated to render training to human services staff providing services in community-based programs.

All agencies interested in responding to this RFP must submit a proposal to the OMH-Division of Children and Families by 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, July 27, 2005.
