**Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) for Water Pollution Control Fund Adjustment**

The New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) and the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) announce an adjustment to the funds made available for the remaining Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2005 Intended Use Plan (IUP) financing period. The USEPA CWSRF appropriation and the associated State match have increased from \$112,200,000 as estimated in the Final FFY 2005 IUP to \$142,727,152. This fund adjustment will be used proportionately for Annual Project Priority List Categories A, B & C to finance cost increases to projects above the current funding lines and to finance contingency projects in these categories in conjunction with funds made available through project by-passing. The funds made available from the appropriation and match adjustment will not result in funding of any new applicants.
