NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS Office of Children and Family Services

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) will hold three public hearings on New York State's proposed multi-year plan to receive assistance under the Social Security Act and the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 1990, also known as the Child Care

and Development Fund. The state's proposed plan will cover the period of 10/1/05-9/30/07.

The purpose of this federal block grant program is to increase the availability, affordability and quality of child care services. Federal funds would be available to assist New York State in supporting subsidies for child day care services to low-income families upon the plan's approval by the United States Department of Health and Human Services. Funding also would be available for improving the quality of child day care services and increasing the availability of early childhood development programs, as well as before and after school services.

Pursuant to the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act, the public is invited to provide input into the development of the final plan. Specific areas for comment include program priorities for child day care; funding distribution priorities; and suggested avenues for local input in shaping the state's child day care agenda. Information about the state's proposed multi-year child care plan will be available on the OCFS website at www.ocfs.state.ny.us/main/beans/stateplan/.

Department of State

Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84(b), the New York State Department of State (DOS) has submitted a routine program change to the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) for the State's Coastal Management Program. The DOS considers this action to be routine and requests OCRM's concurrence in this determination. The change to the New York State Coastal Management Program (CMP) covered by this request would allow for the preparation of partial or component Local Waterfront Revitalization Programs for their subsequent approval by the New York State Secretary of State and incorporation into the State's CMP.

As part of the State's Coastal Management Program, coastal municipalities are encouraged to guide the beneficial use, revitalization, and protection of their coastal resources by preparing a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program. A Local Waterfront Revitalization Program is a comprehensive management program for a community's coastal resources which refines state coastal policies to reflect local conditions and circumstances. Once adopted by the municipality, approved by the New York State Secretary of State, and incorporated into the State's Coastal Management Program as a routine program change, the Local Waterfront Revitalization Program is a basis for local, State, and federal government consistency determinations.

The State's Waterfront Revitalization of Coastal Areas and Inland Waterways Act was amended to allow approval by the Secretary of State of a portion or component of a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, provided that it "constitutes a discrete and cohesive, yet comprehensive, treatment of the subject or subjects addressed, which may be related to environmental, social, regional growth management or economic considerations" (Laws of 2001, Chapter 454).

Preparation of Local Waterfront Revitalization Programs is a principal means of implementing the State's Coastal Management Program, and the ability of municipalities to prepare partial Local Waterfront Revitalization Programs serves to augment the State's commitment to working in partnership with local governments to better manage coastal resources by providing increased flexibility in allowing local governments to address priority issues and/or geographic areas.

Currently, the New York State Coastal Management Program requires that Local Waterfront Revitalization Programs address all applicable coastal policies, commensurate with the particular circumstances of the local government, covering a locality's entire waterfront area. This routine program change revises the New York State Coastal Management Program to provide for the preparation of less than full Local Waterfront Revitalization Programs that would focus on one or more coastal policies of local importance or which address a geographic portion of a municipality's waterfront.

The ability of a coastal community to complete a partial Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, that is one which does not address all applicable coastal policies or its entire waterfront area, will provide increased flexibility to communities to better manage coastal resources and further strengthen the Coastal Management Program's ability to work in partnership with local governments.
