The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The U.S. Department of Interior has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2005-0574 (DA), U.S. Department of Interior is proposing the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor Preservation and Management Plan, prepared pursuant to Public Law 106-554 (December 21, 2001), title VIII, Section 801, Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor Act. The Plan was developed by the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor Commission with the assistance of the U.S. National Park Service. The purpose of the plan is to help guide and direct the Commission in achieving the Congressional intents of the Act, to help interpret the history of the Erie Canal and related canals of the New York Canal System, to enhance canal-related recreation development in the corridor, to help revitalize communities adjacent to the canals, to recommend tourism-related economic development strategies, and to identify strategies for implementation through public and private partnerships.

Any interested parties and/or agencies desiring to express their views concerning the above proposed activity may do so by filing their comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., 15 days from the date of publication of this notice, or September 29, 2005.
