**FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Competitive Grant Program FY 2006**

The State Emergency Management Office (SEMO) Mitigation Branch is requesting Letter of Intent (LOI) followed by a detailed project or planning activity application for FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) competitive grant program FY 2006. The funds will be used to support eligible mitigation measures that include planning initiatives and construction activity that will result in protection from future hazards; retrofitting of facilities; property acquisition or relocation; and other types of projects that will result in protection to public or private property. Please note: Applicants eligible for project grants include those that currently have or will soon have a FEMA-approved and adopted multi-hazard mitigation plan in place before the date of selection for award (estimated at March 2006). A listing of mitigation activities awarded grant funding from PDM program FY 2003 and 2005 as well as general program information for the FY 2006 program has been made available on the following FEMA web page: <http://www.fema.gov/fima/pdm.shtm>.

The LOI will be accepted through September 14, 2005 and must be submitted by; State level agencies, Federally-recognized Indian Tribal governments, local governments to include county, town, village and cities, state-recognized Indian tribes, and public colleges and universities. Private colleges and universities and non-profit organizations are not eligible sub-applicants; however, eligible sub-applicant such as local governments may apply for assistance on their behalf. Applications will be accepted by FEMA through January 17, 2006, 11:59 p.m.. Development, completion and sub-mission of applications will be performed through the FEMA's web-based Mitigation Electronic Grants (eGrants) Management System accessed at the following address: <https://portal.fema.gov/famsVu/dynamic/mitigation.html>. Once a determination is made that the mitigation activity proposed on the LOI fits eligibility criteria an access ID code will be issued to the applicant and prompted to register on the eGrants system and begin the application process.
