The New York District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In **F-2006-0310 (DA)**, the **New York District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers** is proposing the maintenance dredging of the South Brother Island Reach in the East River, Queens County, New York. The proposed maintenance dredging would involve the removal of up to 265,000 cubic yards of material by clamshell dredge, or similar plant. The entire channel will generally not require maintenance dredging, dredging will only be required in those portions where shoaling has reduced channel depth.

The South Brother Island Channel, 35 feet deep and 400 feet wide, with widening at the junction with the main channel, and a turning basin at the head of the channel will be dredged to a project depth of 35 feet below MLW plus 2 feet allowable over depth. The purpose of the proposed dredging is to maintain the authorized project dimensions, thereby assuring safe and economical use of the South Brother Island Channel, by shipping interests. The dredged material would be

used for remediation material at the HARS. The proposed dredged material would be transported to the site by bottom dumping vessels. Any interested parties and/or agencies desiring to express their views concerning the above proposed activity may do so by filing their comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., **15 days from the date of publication of this notice, or May 11, 2006.**

The purpose of the proposed dredging is to maintain the authorized project dimensions, thereby assuring safe economic use of the New York and New Jersey channels by shipping interests.
