The lease has a two year primary term; delay rentals during the primary term are \$15 per acre per year. The previously noticed (July 26, 2006) provision relating to the adjustment of medical assistance rates of payments to providers of personal care services for recruitment and retention of employees is being clarified to state that this adjustment is only for programs providing services in local social services districts that do not include a city with a population of over one million persons. The aggregate amount available for this adjustment is four million dollars effective for the period August 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006.

Notice of a 60-Day Review and Comment Period
for the Town of Rhinebeck
Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program

A major component of New York State's Coastal Management Program (CMP) is the provision that local governments be allowed to prepare Local Waterfront Revitalization Programs, which further detail and make geographically specific the State's Coastal Policies. Pursuant to Article 42 of the New York State Executive Law and 19 NYCRR Part 601, the New York State Department of State has received and accepted a Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program from the Town of Rhinebeck. To approve the Town of Rhinebeck Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, the Secretary of State must find that it is consistent with Article 42 of the NYS Executive Law and that it does not conflict with existing State programs and policies.

The Town of Rhinebeck has completed preparation of a Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP). The LWRP is a locally prepared, comprehensive land and water use plan for its natural, public, and developed waterfront resources. The Town of Rhinebeck prepared its Draft LWRP with assistance from the New York State Department of State and in accordance with the New York State Waterfront Revitalization of Coastal Areas and Inland Waterways Act and the New York State Coastal Management Program. The Town of Rhinebeck LWRP is a comprehensive coastal management program that is based on the policies of the New York State Coastal Management Program. It provides a comprehensive framework within which critical waterfront issues can be addressed and waterfront improvement projects can be pursued and implemented.

Because a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) is an official document and program with provisions that are binding on numerous local, State, and Federal agencies for a broad range of activities, it is necessary to have a thorough process of local, State, and Federal review of the LWRP prior to local adoption and Department of State approval of each LWRP.

The Rhinebeck Town Board accepted their Draft LWRP as complete and ready for public review by resolution on June 19, 2006. Similarly, the Rhinebeck Draft LWRP was then accepted by the New York State Department of State as complete and ready for public review and the following New York State required official 60-day review period dates have been established: August 21, 2006 to October 20, 2006. At the close of the required 60-day review period, the Department of State will coordinate responses to comments received with the Town of Rhinebeck, and appropriate modifications to the LWRP document will be made to address comments.

Copies of the Rhinebeck Draft LWRP have been distributed to local, regional, State, and Federal agencies for review during this 60-day review period and may also be viewed and downloaded from the following Department of State website: www.nyswaterfronts.com. Copies of the Rhinebeck LWRP are also available for review at the office of the Division of Coastal Resources, NYS Department of State, 41 State Street, Albany, NY; and the municipal offices of the Town of Rhinebeck located at the Town Clerk's Office, Rhinebeck Town Hall, 80 East Market Street, Rhinebeck, NY.

Also, please note that following this State-required 60-Day Review period, and pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84(b), the New York State Department of State (DOS) intends to submit a request to the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) to have the

Town of Rhinebeck LWRP included as a routine program change to New York State's Coastal Management Program. The DOS considers the action of incorporating of the Town of Rhinebeck LWRP into New York State's Coastal Management Program to be routine and will be requesting OCRM's concurrence in this determination.
