### Environmental Facilities Corporation Notice of Availability of Financial Assistance Pipeline for Jobs Fund Program

#### I. BACKGROUND, SCOPE AND APPLICABILITY

The New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation ("EFC" or "Corporation") will provide up to \$11.25 million in financial assistance to a recipient or recipients from the New York State Pipeline For Jobs Fund ("Fund") for the planning, design and construction of eligible projects which are intended to create, improve or extend water supply facilities, including, but not limited to, drinking water facilities and cold water supply facilities. All eligible projects must demonstrate an economic development purpose on behalf of business.

This funding will be made pursuant to the New York State Pipeline for Jobs Fund Program that was created and established by Section 13 of Chapter 624 of the Laws of 1999, and the associated implementing regulations (21 NYCRR Part 2605).

#### II. PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE

As required by Part 2605, this Notice describes eligibility requirements for the New York State Pipeline For Jobs Fund Program ("Program"), the amount of funding available, the time period during which EFC will accept pre-applications for funding, the anticipated date the Corporation expects to issue confirmation that assistance is available to project sponsors and certain other requirements.

#### III. DESCRIPTION OF ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

Projects eligible for funding under the Program must demonstrate an economic development purpose on behalf of business and may include the costs associated with the planning, design and construction of projects to create, improve or extend water supply facilities. These projects may include drinking water facilities and cold water supply facilities. These same projects may be eligible for financing under or designed to comply with the requirements of the safe drinking water act or other applicable federal or state drinking water laws and standards.

It is noted that, pursuant to the regulations, no financial assistance will be made available to projects currently listed on the Drinking Water Intended Use Plan (DWIUP), which are scheduled to receive funding from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF).

#### IV. PRE-APPLICATION PROCESS

In order to be considered to receive financial assistance from the Fund, each project sponsor must submit a pre-application to the Corporation. The pre-application shall include information sufficient for the Corporation to evaluate the proposed project. The project sponsor must submit the following information to the Corporation.

- (1) A written request from the project sponsor that the proposed project be listed in the DWIUP (DWIUP listing forms are available at: <http://www.health.state.ny.us/nysdoh/water/final/2006/attach4.htm>).
- (2) A description of the proposed project, including its location, estimated cost, a project construction schedule that includes the estimated dates of construction commencement and completion, and complete project sponsor information.
- (3) A description of the need for the project.
- (4) The economic development impact of the proposed project, including, but not limited to, the number of jobs estimated to be created or retained, the average annual wage of any new or retained jobs, the percentage of employees that are resident in the State of New York, estimated share of products or services sold within the State, the economic benefit to the State, costs and benefits of the project, the types of businesses benefitted by the project, including the principal standard industrial classification (SIC) code(s) of each.
- (5) Other sources of funding for the eligible project including any and all subsidies that have been provided to the project (i.e. sales and mortgage recording tax exemptions, property tax abatements, etc.).

In addition, non-municipal pre-applicants must submit the following.

- (1) Information on the creditworthiness of the project sponsor, including financial statements and other relevant documents the Corporation determines are necessary to determine such creditworthiness.
- (2) Information regarding the project sponsor, including information on any past felony convictions and other crimes of moral turpitude.

**V. AMOUNT OF FUNDING**

The Corporation will provide up to \$11.25 million from the Fund for eligible projects.

**VI. PRE-APPLICATION AND COMMITMENT SCHEDULE**

EFC will accept pre-applications for New York State Pipeline For Job Fund Program through September 8, 2006. A pre-application form is available at the address listed below or at EFC's website, [www.nysefc.org/](http://www.nysefc.org/) (under "Programs" click on "click on the Pipeline for Jobs").

EFC will notify each successful project contact by written confirmation letter of the amount of financial assistance reserved for their project. EFC is expected to forward confirmation letters to successful project contacts on or about October 6, 2006.

**VII. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

The procedures for administering the New York State Pipeline for Jobs Fund Program, including the submission and evaluation of pre-applications, processing, and distribution of financial assistance will be governed by 21 NYCRR Part 2605.

These rates are applicable to the New York State personal income tax (Article 22 of the Tax Law - except for rates of interest payable by or to an employer with respect to income taxes required to be withheld and paid over by the employer pursuant to Part V of such Article 22), unincorporated business income tax (Article 23 of the Tax Law), estate tax (Article 26 of the Tax Law), gift tax (Article 26-A of the Tax Law), generation-skipping transfer tax (Article 26-B of the Tax Law), the New York City resident income tax (Article 30 of the Tax Law, Chapter 17 of the New York City Administrative Code), the New York City nonresident earnings tax (Article 2-E of the General City Law, Chapter 19 of the New York City Administrative Code), the City of Yonkers resident income tax surcharge (Article 30-A of the Tax Law, Article IX of the Codes and Ordinances of the City of Yonkers) and the City of Yonkers nonresident earnings tax (Article 30-B of the Tax Law, Article X of the Codes and Ordinances of the City of Yonkers).

months of October, November, and December 2006 at 7 percent per annum; and sets the underpayment rate of interest for the purposes of said subsection for the months of October, November, and December 2006 at 10 percent per annum.
