## **Parent Partners in Health Education Training**

Up to four grants of up to \$45,000 each will be funded by DDPC for a 15-month period to develop and implement the Illinois "Parent Partners in Health Education Training" curriculum within a New York State primary care medical residency training setting. The initial three months of the 15-month grant cycle will focus on program planning and development while the remaining 12 months will be spent on implementation and evaluation. The grants may be renewed for two additional 12-month periods for up to \$35,000 each for continued implementation. Grants in varying amounts may be awarded; the applicant's program and budget narratives must provide the justification for the amount requested.

This is Phase III of a project which is currently being implemented in New York by eight primary care residency programs. Selected programs will be required to replicate *Parent Partners in Health Education* developed by the University of Illinois College of Medicine and funded by the Illinois Council on Developmental Disabilities, as well as to partner with parents of children with disabilities to provide the parent training/interview component.

All interested applicants are required to submit a one-page letter of intent by December 15, 2006 to Robin Worobey, Program Planner at the address above. Upon receipt of the Letter of Intent, all applicants will receive a CD-ROM containing all "Parent Partners in Health Education Training" documents and tools. All final grant applications should be sent to Sheila Carey, Executive Director, and must be delivered to the DDPC office by close of business (5:00 pm) on January 3, 2007.

## **Child Abduction Prevention Education Program**

Funds totaling \$1 million are available for grants to help schools districts and BOCES meet the statutory requirement to provide instruction in the prevention of abduction for all students in kindergarten through eighth grades. Grants can not exceed \$10,000 per applicant. Grantees may use funds to develop or adopt a curriculum and/or implement an instructional program to help prevent child abduction. All grant funds must be obligated by June 30, 2007.
