The Department of Health intends to amend the Title XIX (Medicaid) State Plan for non-institutional services to reflect recently enacted legislation.

Non-Institutional Services:

Effective January 1, 2007, rates of payment for private duty nursing services provided to medically fragile children shall be increased to ensure the availability of services to these children. The increased rates for services rendered to medically fragile children may take into account the elements of cost, geographical differentials of costs considered, economic factors in the area in which the nursing service is provided, and the need for incentives to improve services and institute economies. These increased rates shall be payable only to those private duty nurses who can demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Department of Health, satisfactory training and experience to provide services to these children. The basis for the increase to these rates of payment shall be the application of the case mix adjustment factor for AIDS home care services as determined pursuant to applicable Department of Health regulations.

These increased rates of payment for private duty nursing services provided to medically fragile children should increase the availability of these services available outside of the institutional setting, and allow more medically fragile children to remain in a community setting. Consequently, rates of payment established through this statute will result in budget neutrality to the Medicaid program.

OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Workforce Investment Act – Waiver Request, Common Measures Pursuant to §136(b)(2) and (c)(1), §189(i)(4)(B); 20 CFR Final Rules §661.400, §661.410, §661.420(c), §666.100 and §666.300 of the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) of 1998, the Department of Labor (DOL) hereby gives public notice that New York State is requesting a waiver of the performance measures specified in WIA Section 136(b)(2) and (c)(1), as well as accompanying provisions in Section 666.100(a) and 666.300(a) of the WIA Final Rules.

If granted this waiver, the state would adopt and report on the Common Measures, as defined in Training and Employment Guidance Letter 17-05, issued February 17, 2006, for the WIA program, beginning with Program Year 2006 (July 1, 2006-June 30, 2007).

This request will be submitted to the United States Department of Labor under the provisions of WIA section 189(i)(4)(B) and sections 661.400, 661.410, 661.420(c), 666.100 and 666.300 of the WIA Final Rules.

Currently the New York State DOL must track and report on the 17 measures of performance defined in the WIA legislation cited above. At the same time, the States must also apply and report on certain common measures definitions as required by the United States Department of Labor (USDOL) for Program Year 2006. Discontinuation of the 17 performance measures, through implementation of this waiver, will limit duplication of the data reporting requirements currently in effect and is the next logical step in implementing the national objective of a system-wide performance accountability approach as envisioned by USDOL.

This waiver supports the intent cited in New York State's Strategic Plan for Title IB of the Workforce Investment Act and Wagner-Peyser Act to align strategy, customers and performance measures between and across all levels of the workforce development system. The waiver is also in keeping with the New York State DOL request to negotiate a single standard for WIA and Wagner-Peyser programs with the USDOL Regional Office for Program Year 2006. This waiver request, therefore, is consistent with New York State's ongoing efforts to integrate service delivery by instituting common standards and outcomes across programs in order to establish a truly seamless workforce development system for the benefit of all customers.

This system improvement will also remove barriers to clear and concise measures of success for business, customers and other stakeholders by placing a clearer focus on accountability at all levels of the system by holding all programs to a consistent set of performance criteria.

If granted this waiver, New York State would operate solely under the six common measures for Adults/Dislocated Workers (Entered Employment, Employment Retention and Average Earnings) and Youth (Placement in Employment or Education, Attainment of a Degree or Certificate and Literacy and Numeracy Gains) for Program Year 2006. This will position New York State to be in compliance with common measures reporting by the time it is fully implemented by USDOL.

The state intends to achieve various goals through enactment of this waiver. Having the flexibility to implement a single set of performance criteria under the common measures will improve the statewide workforce investment system by eliminating duplicative, overlapping and confusing reporting requirements and allowing the state and local systems to achieve full implementation of the common measures. Local Workforce Investment Boards and training providers can be held

accountable to a single and uniform set of performance criteria. Barriers to comprehensive and integrated case management caused by the need to simultaneously manage two inconsistent performance assessment systems will be removed.

There are no identified state or local obstacles to implementation of the requested waiver. New York State recently modified its One Stop Operating System (OSOS) for data reporting and case management to support the implementation of common measures as well as functional alignment of WIA and Wagner-Peyser service delivery and structure.

Elimination of dual performance accountability and reporting systems, as outlined in this request, will significantly contribute to the state's ongoing efforts to eliminate duplication, streamline programs and align its workforce services.

All customers and service providers in the statewide workforce investment system could be positively impacted by the elimination of a dual set of performance criteria. Individual customers will be presented with more consistent service offerings among programs and a common set of goals.

Providers will have clearer performance directives and will be able to focus on designing services around one set of performance criteria, thus spending less time on duplicative tracking and reporting and more time on direct customer service.

Local Workforce Investment Areas and partner staff will likewise benefit from facilitated case management and continuity of services among programs.

Summary of Notice

New York State is requesting a waiver of the 17 WIA performance measures currently required in WIA 136(b)(2) and (c)(1) and in 666.100(a) and 666.300(a) of the Final Rules. As provided in 661.400 of the Final Rules, the state hopes to act upon the flexibility inherent in the legislation in order to promote continuous improvement of its statewide workforce investment system. Use of the common measures as the system's uniform performance accountability mechanism would alleviate the confusing and conflicting sets of measures currently in place. A single set of measures gives more clear and concise feedback to customers, businesses and the public about program outcome goals. More seamless delivery of services would be experienced by all those who interact with the state's workforce system. Being granted this waiver will move New York State forward in full implementation of the common measures developed by USDOL and in providing an integrated and aligned performance accountability system.
