"Notice is hereby given that the City of Buffalo has on the 15th day of September, 2005 entered into an amendment to the Finance Agreement (as defined below) with the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority (the "Authority") and the Buffalo Water Board. The Finance Agreement, dated as of September 24, 1992, as amended by Amendments dated as of July 7, 1995, June 19, 1996 and August 1, 1997 (the "Finance Agreement") by and between the City of Buffalo, the Authority and the Buffalo Water Board related to the construction and financing of water facilities pursuant to the Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority Act for the purpose of placing the City of Buffalo's water system on an independent basis, imposing fees and rents on water system users which, together with other revenues available for such purpose, if any, are sufficient to pay to the Authority debt service on bonds issued by the Authority pursuant to the Finance Agreement and for operation and maintenance of the facility (title to which was transferred to the Buffalo Water Board pursuant to the Finance Agreement). The Amendment, in general terms, provides that the Authority shall have the power to enter into Qualified Swap Agreements for the realization of Debt Service Savings in connection with the issuance of the bonds of the Authority. A copy of the complete Finance Agreement and Amendment is on file for public inspection in the office of the clerk of the City of Buffalo where the same may be examined by any interested person during regular business hours. The validity of this

Amendment may be hereafter contested only upon the ground or grounds that: (i) such Amendment violates, or the performance of any provision hereof by any party thereto would violate, the provisions of any law or the state constitution, or (ii) the provisions of law which should have been complied with in relation to the authorization and execution were not substantially complied with, and in any event an action, suit or proceeding is commenced within sixty days after the date of this notice.

- Accredite the teacher education program offered by Sarah Lawrence College, ... including the stipulation made by the Higher Education Subcommittee of the State Professional Standards and Practices Board for Teaching, effective January 10, 2006, for a period beginning immediately and ending on January 9, 2013.
- Accredite the teacher education programs offered by Pratt Institute, effective January 10, 2006, for a period beginning immediately and ending on January 9, 2009, with the following conditions: (1) that Pratt submit annual progress reports to the State Education Department with respect to the 27 areas for improvement cited in the Compliance Review Report and summarized in the Deputy Commissioner's revised recommendation dated November 2, 2005; and (2) that Pratt undergo a focused site visit to be conducted three years from this action, and that such site visit shall indicate compliance with Regents' Rules, including specific confirmation that (a) the faculty collective bargaining contract complies with Commissioner's Regulations regarding faculty work load; (b) three new full-time faculty members have been added to the Education Department; and (c) all deficiencies cited in the Compliance Review Report have been corrected, all as recommended in the Deputy Commissioner's November 2, 2005, revised recommendation. Accreditation beyond January 9, 2009, shall be contingent on a finding that Pratt's programs are in all respects in compliance with Regents' Rules, Subpart 4-2.
- Accredite the teacher education programs offered by Daemen College, effective January 10, 2006, for a period beginning immediately and ending on January 9, 2009, with the following conditions: (1) that the College submit annual progress reports to the State Education Department with respect to the 14 areas for improvement cited in the Compliance Review Report and summarized in the Deputy Commissioner's revised recommendation dated November 9, 2005; and (2) that the College undergo a focused site visit to be conducted three years from this action, and that such site visit shall indicate compliance with Regents' Rules, including specific confirmation that (a) faculty hired are working in the programs; (b) a proper assessment system is in place and data is properly collected; (c) bi-monthly meetings are held between Education and Liberal

Arts faculty; (d) course sequencing and other curriculum adjustments have been made; and (e) all deficiencies cited in the Compliance Review Report have been corrected, all as recommended in the Deputy Commissioner's November 9, 2005 revised recommendation. Accreditation beyond January 9, 2009, shall be contingent on a finding that the College's programs are in all respects in compliance with Regents' Rules, Subpart 4-2.

The New York State Department of Health (DOH) is required by the provisions of the federal Beaches Environmental Assessment and Coastal Health (BEACH) Act to provide for public review and comment on the Department's beach monitoring and notification plan. The BEACH Act (Section 406(b) of the Clean Water Act) enacted a federal Environmental Protection Agency grant program available to states, such as New York, with coastal recreational waters. Coastal recreational waters include the Great Lakes and marine coastal waters that are designated for swimming, bathing, surfing, or similar water contact activities. The Act is not applicable to inland waters or waters upstream of the mouth of a river or stream having an unimpaired natural connection with the open sea.

The beach monitoring and public notification plan also includes information on the beach evaluation and classification process, including a list of waters to be monitored and beach ranking. Also

included in this plan, is the sampling design and monitoring plan, including sampling location and sampling frequency. Lastly the plan contains information on procedures for public notification and risk communication, including methods to notify the public of a swimming advisory or beach closure.

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Depart-

ment of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2006-0001 (DA), the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (Coast Guard) is proposing designating the area as a special anchorage area in accordance with 33 U.S.C. 471. In accordance with that statute, vessels will not be required to sound signals or exhibit anchor lights or shapes which are otherwise required by rule 30 and 35 of the Inland Navigation Rules, codified at 33 U.S.C. 2030 and 2035. The proposed special anchorage area will be located on the west side of the Hudson River about 1,800 yards south of Bowline Point, well removed from the channel and located where general navigation will not endanger or be endangered by unlighted vessels. Providing anchorage well removed from the channel and general navigation would greatly increase navigational safety.

This special anchorage area is part of a waterfront revitalization project authorized under U.S. Army Corps of Engineers permit number 2004-00596-YR. This proposed rule is in response to a request made by the Village of Haverstraw to help ensure the safe navigation resulting from the increased vessel traffic expected to arrive along the village waterfront due to this revitalization effort.
