2005-0783 Matter of Silvestri Architects for CRS Properties, Attention: John Cerio, 136 Maple Road, Williamsville, NY 14221 for a variance concerning fire-safety requirements, including requirements of providing openings in exterior walls that are less than three feet from the lot line, and an increase in building height and number of stories.

Involved is the conversion of and addition to an existing building for commercial and residential use, located at 215 West Fayette Street, City of Syracuse, County of Onondaga, State of New York.

2005-0887 Matter of Robert Abbott Jr., Architect for Robert Pomfrey-POMCO, 2501 James Street, Syracuse, NY 13206 for a variance concerning fire-safety requirements, including providing openings in exterior walls of an addition into adjacent buildings that are less than three feet from the lot line.
