

EXECUTIVE ORDERS

Executive Order No. 127.1: Revoking and Rescinding Executive Order Number 127.

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2003, I issued Executive Order Number 127, which provided for additional disclosure by persons and organizations contacting State government regarding State procurement and real estate transactions;

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2005, I approved Chapter 1 of the Laws of 2005, the Omnibus Lobbying Reform Act of 2005, which provided for a comprehensive system to regulate and disclose attempts to influence state and local government procurement decisions;

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2006, the Advisory Council on Procurement Lobbying, an entity created pursuant to Chapter 1 of the Laws of 2005 to provide advice and make recommendations as to the implementation of Chapter 1, recommended that I revoke Executive Order Number 127 because it is duplicative and unnecessary due to the enactment of Chapter 1.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE E. PATAKI, Governor of the State of New York, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of New York, do hereby revoke and rescind Executive Order No. 127.
