The New York Power Authority (Authority) will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, January 10, 2007, on a new ratemaking standard for retail customers, as it is required to consider by the Energy Policy Act (EPACT) of 2005. The Demand Response and Smart Metering Standard centers on application of time-of-use rate schedules and metering equipment, reflecting any variance during different time periods in cost of generating and purchasing electricity at the wholesale level. EPACT, which modified the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978, provided for public comment as part of the consideration of the appropriateness of the new standard for various customer categories.

Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84 (b)(2), that

To accommodate the Nissequogue River Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat, the amended boundary follows the boundary of Blydenburgh County Park, extending northwest from the existing coastal area boundary at the New Millpond Dam along the Park boundary to Brookside Drive, then continuing to follow the Blydenburgh County Park boundary southwest to the south end of New Millpond. The amended boundary then extends southwesterly, approximately following the 30 foot contour to the Veterans Memorial Highway. The amended boundary then follows a stream south beneath the highway, including a small pond which lies

contiguous with the highway's south side. The amended coastal boundary then follows the perimeter of the wetland lying east of and contiguous with the Suffolk County waste treatment facility northwest to the Blydenburgh Park boundary west of New Millpond, where it follows this boundary north to the south end of New Millpond Dam, where it joins the existing coastal area boundary.

To accommodate the Grandifolia Sandhills Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat, the coastal area boundary is amended at a point approximately 2,000 feet from the southeast corner of the habitat boundary. The habitat boundary crosses the existing coastal area boundary line, extending approximately 500 feet, then extends southwesterly approximately 1,800 feet, then extends northwesterly approximately 700 feet, where it crosses the existing coastal area boundary, continuing in a northwesterly direction.

Federal consistency provisions in 15 CFR Part 930 apply with the approved change effective on the date of publication of this notice.
