## ORGANIZATIONS INTERESTED IN IMPLEMENTING HEALTH PROMOTION WORKSHOP FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES "Living Well with a Disability" Program

The New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) Disability and Health Program and Health Research, Inc. (HRI) are seeking organizations interested in implementing the "Living Well with a Disability" program. This is the seventh year that the Disability and Health Program has offered this funding opportunity. We are primarily seeking applications from organizations that have not been funded through this program in the past. Previous awardees are eligible to apply; however, greater weight will be given to new applicants.

Funding is provided by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and is administered by HRI. Awardees will be expected to sign a contract with HRI. The "Living Well with a Disability" program is a proven intervention in the prevention of secondary conditions in people with disabilities. We anticipate that up to five applications will be funded. Maximum funding for each grantee is \$4,800. We are inviting Independent Living Centers, rehabilitation programs, and other organizations serving adults with physical disabilities who have experience with the peer group process to submit proposals to conduct this workshop series. The Department of Health reserves the right to award grants based on geographic or regional considerations to serve the best interests of the state.

## LICENSED OMH CLINIC PROVIDER (ARTICLE 28 OR 31) IN GOOD STANDING; NOT-FOR-PROFIT AGENCY ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE STATE AID

### Child and Family Clinic Plus – New York City

The New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH) is pleased to announce the implementation of Child and Family Clinic-Plus for the New York City region. Clinic-Plus will provide new opportunities for the early recognition and treatment of emotional disturbance in children. Child and Family Clinic-Plus providers will provide the following: broad-based screening in natural environments, comprehensive assessment, expanded clinic capacity, in-home services and evidence based treatment. This initiative creates the opportunity for OMH licensed clinics to apply for designation as a Child and Family Clinic-Plus.

**ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS:** Applicants must be a currently licensed OMH clinic provider (Article 28 or 31) in good standing. The provider must be a not-for-profit agency that is eligible to receive State Aid. In addition, applicants must currently be a part or apply for the Clinic Quality Improvement Initiative under OMH. Materials available include the Guidance Document for Child and Family Clinic-Plus (which contains detailed programmatic, clinical and fiscal guidance), the Clinic-Plus Calculator (a tool for estimating service capacity and revenue), the Request for Proposal and the Request for Proposal Template (format for RFP response).

**LETTER OF INTENT (MANDATORY):** September 6, 2006. Agencies interested in responding to the Request for Proposal must submit a Letter of Intent to Bid to the New York City Field Office by 5:00pm on September 6, 2006. The Letter of Intent shall be non-binding.

**BIDDERS CONFERENCE (MANDATORY):** September 18, 2006. Only those who have submitted a Letter of Intent can attend the Bidders Conference. Providers who have not attended the Bidders Conference will be disqualified and not considered.
