The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal law to provide timely public notice for the activity described below, which is subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The U.S. Department of the Navy has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2006-0470 DA, the U.S. Department of the Navy, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Mid-Atlantic is proposing the excavation, grading, and construction of a 1,200 linear foot stone revetment to mitigate ongoing erosion and deterioration of a 1,000 linear foot steel sheet piling which supports a pavement area along Jamaica Bay, in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. The total volume of fill required for the proposed project is approximately 6,500 cubic yards, which includes 4,300 cubic yards of armor rock and 2,200 cubic yards of filter stone. All fill will be placed on the landward side of the existing seawall, however, the proposed project will result in the placement of 0.77 acres of fill in waters of the United States. The fill area assumes the entire slope will be constructed as a 2:1 slope.

Any interested parties and/or agencies desiring to express their views concerning the above proposed activity may do so by filing their comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., **15 days from the date of publication of this notice, or October 5, 2006.**
