In F-2007-1064, New York Container Terminal, Inc. (NYCT) is proposing to expand its existing marine terminal facility, located at the foot of Richmond Terrace along the Arthur Kill and Bridge Creek in Richmond County, New York. The purpose of the proposed activity is to accommodate new, larger classes of container ships that will increasingly make up the North Atlantic shipping fleets, and increase throughputs and the near term capacity of the existing NYCT.

Specifically, the proposed activity involves the development of a new, fourth berth and associated marine terminal area on the adjacent property to the northeast of the existing facility ("Parcel C"), a previously utilized marine-related site, partial brownfield, and tidal wetlands associated with Arlington Marsh. The design includes the a new 1,340 pile-supported wharf, a new berth with a 50-foot mean low water depth, four quay cranes, approximately 38 acres of container handling and storage area, and a new marine building.

Approximately 17.53 acres of wetlands would be permanently impacted as a result of the proposed activity. Specifically, 7.4 acres of vegetated wetlands would be affected through dredging and/or permanent filling. A portion of the vegetated wetlands are within the New York City designated Northwest Harbor / Harbor Herons Special Natural Waterfront Area.

In F-2008-0181 DA, the Buffalo District of the United States Army Corps of Engineers (the Corps) is proposing the restoration of fish passage to Chautauqua Creek in the Town of Westfield, in Chautauqua County, New York. The Westfield Water Works Dams are a pair of small dams located along Chautauqua Creek approximately 300 feet apart and approximately 5 miles upstream from the mouth of the creek at Lake Erie. The lower dam is no longer in use and represents a significant barrier to the upstream migration of most fish species. Specifically, the proposed plan involves the partial removal of the lower dam and the construction of a rock ramp fishway at the upper dam. The proposed activity would open up approximately 10 miles of good quality spawning habitat in an effort to develop sustainable populations of wild steelhead trout.
