Extension: Request for Public Comments (RFPC) concerning a study of electronic records policy for New York State.

The purpose of the RFPC is to gather stakeholder input regarding the mechanisms and processes for obtaining access to and reading electronic data so that such data can be created, maintained, exchanged, and preserved by the state in a manner that encourages appropriate government control, access, choice, interoperability, and vendor neutrality. The study is being performed pursuant to the 2007 Laws of

New York, Chapter 477, codified at State Technology Law § 305(4). Information gathered from responses to the RFPC may be used by CIO/OFT to help direct the findings and recommendations of the study.

Responses to the RFPC were originally due close of business December 28, 2007. Due to public demand, the time frame for submitting written responses is being extended until close of business January 18, 2008.
