2009-0201 Matter of William Papke, 1921 Tonawanda Creek Road, Amherst, NY 14228 for a variance concerning building areas, sprinkler system, fire hydrant and toilet facilities.

Involved is the construction of a one-story, non-combustible building of mercantile occupancy, located at 1921 Tonawanda Creek Road, Town of Amherst, County of Erie, State of New York.

2009-0205 Matter of Steven Morse, 8665 Millcreek Drive, Clarence, NY 14051 for a variance concerning egress window dimensions.
