NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Insurance Department

The Insurance Department will hold, pursuant to Section 2305 of the Workers' Compensation Law, a public hearing in New York City to determine whether to approve a proposed workers' compensation insurance 2010 loss cost increase of 7.7 percent filed with the Insurance Department by the New York Compensation Insurance Rating Board (NYCIRB), to be effective October 1, 2010 if approved.

If approved, the loss cost will be used by workers' compensation insurance companies in setting rates. The hearing will take place on Wednesday, June 23, 2010 beginning at 11 a.m. at the following address:
