NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Education Department

PURSUANT to Section 137 of Chapter 82 of the Laws of 1995, the State Education Department hereby gives public notice that on Monday, June 14, 2010, the Board of Regents will hold a public hearing in the Genesee Valley Region of New York State on a proposal from Strayer University, Washington, DC, for permission to operate in a limited capacity in New York State. It is seeking authorization to offer instruction leading to the Associate in Arts in Business Administration (AABA); the Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.); and the Master of Business Administration (MBA) degrees to Verizon Wireless Call Center employees at 133 Calkins Road, Rochester, NY. The programs are limited to enrollment by Verizon employees at this location.

The hearing is being held at the request of affected institutions, as required by Section 137 of Chapter 82 of the Laws of 1995. Town of Hamlin Local Waterfront Revitalization Program

STATEWIDE -- Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84(b)(4), the New York State Department of State (DOS) hereby gives notice that the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) concurred on February 26, 2010 on the incorporation of a minor amendment to the Town of Hamlin Local Waterfront Revitalization Program into the State's Coastal Management Program (CMP) as a Routine Program Change. DOS requested OCRM's concurrence on this action in a letter dated August 10, 2009, and in a previous notice in the State Register, on September 30, 2009, which further described the content of the action.

The amendment to the Town's LWRP refines the NYS CMP through addition of Policy 7B, modification of Policy 35, and deletion of Policy 2A. Other changes to the State's enforceable policies based on the LWRP are essentially the same as those found in State law under 19 NYCRR, Part 600.5. Pursuant to the State CMP and Article 42 of the Executive Law, the Town of Hamlin LWRP was adopted by the Town on November 10, 2005, and approved by the New York State Secretary of State on August 20, 2008. Federal consistency with the Town of Hamlin LWRP applies as of the date of this notice.

Town of Tonawanda Local Waterfront Revitalization Program

STATEWIDE -- Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84(b)(4), the New York State Department of State (DOS) hereby gives notice that the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) concurred on February 26, 2010 on the incorporation of a minor amendment to the Town of Tonawanda Local Waterfront Revitalization Program into the State's Coastal Management Program (CMP) as a Routine Program Change. DOS requested OCRM's concurrence on this action in a letter dated August 10, 2009, and in a previous notice in the State Register, on September 30, 2009, which further described the content of the action.

The amendment to the Town's LWRP refines the NYS CMP through revision of the coastal boundary from 1,000 feet to 500 feet inland of River Road, the modification of Policy 1B and Policy 11A, and the deletion of Policy 1C. Pursuant to the State CMP and Article 42 of the Executive Law, the Town of Tonawanda LWRP was adopted by the Town on April 7, 2008, and approved by the New York State Secretary of State on September 17, 2008. Federal consistency with the Town of Tonawanda LWRP applies as of the date of this notice.
