Public Notice for the Lake Erie Concord Grape Belt Heritage Area Management Plan pursuant to Title G, Article 35.03 and 35.05 of the New York Parks Recreation and Historic Preservation Law.

The New York State Legislature established the Lake Erie Concord Grape Belt Heritage Area in 2006 for the purpose of preserving and enhancing the historic, cultural and natural resources of the Concord Grape Belt in Chautauqua County, New York. The Concord Grape Belt Heritage Area Association prepared a management plan to be utilized for planning, preservation and enhancement of the Heritage Area. On September 7, 2010, the County of Chautauqua, on behalf of the Lake Erie Concord Grape Belt Association and the designated municipalities, submitted the Concord Grape Belt Heritage Area Heritage Area Management Plan. The municipalities included as part of this submission include all or a portion of the Towns of Ripley, Westfield, Portland, Chautauqua, Pomfret, Dunkirk, Sheridan and Hanover and the Villages of Westfield, Brocton, Fredonia, Silver Creek, Forestville, and the City of Dunkirk.

Office for People with Developmental Disabilities

Pursuant to 42 CFR 447.205, the NYS Office for People with Developmental Disabilities and NYS Department of Health hereby give notice of the following:

OPWDD proposes to change its methods and standards for setting Medicaid prices for residential habilitation services in Individualized Residential Alternatives (IRAs) and Community Residences (CRs) and for group day habilitation services effective January 1, 2011. The change will deal specifically with the reimbursement of capital moveable equipment and property insurance.

Historically, these items have been grouped with capital expenditures and have been subject to an annual review. Price sheets have been updated annually to reflect the actual costs incurred by providers or depreciation expense recognized. The document utilized for the review was the Consolidated Fiscal Report (CFR) for the period two years previous to the current price period. Accordingly, reimbursement incorporates a two year lag. This process will change with these regulations. Provider capital moveable equipment and property insurance will be regarded as fixed costs and categorized as "other than personal service" expenses (OTPS). OPWDD will determine a representative fixed value for capital moveable equipment and for property insurance by examining CFR data reported over a three year period. Once implemented, when trend factors are approved for operating costs, these components will be trended by virtue of the OTPS classification.

This measure is one of many streamlining efforts being undertaken by OPWDD. After the initial conversion, the annual updating process for reimbursing these components will be eliminated; however, there will be an OPWDD review of funding levels for the 2016 and 2016/17 price periods. This streamlining initiative has the advantage of providing predictability to providers in the reimbursement of provider equipment and property insurance costs.

OPWDD does not expect these changes to result in any increase or decrease in annual aggregate expenditures.

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activities described below, which are subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The United States Department of Homeland Security – United States Coast Guard has determined that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The consistency determination and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at One Commerce Plaza, 99 Washington Avenue in Albany, New York.

In F-2010-1040 DA, the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) is proposing to perform maintenance dredging of the existing mooring basin at the USCG Station Fire Island. The proposed work will take place within Great South Bay, adjacent to the Robert Moses State Park, Fire Island, Town of Babylon, County of Suffolk.

The proposal involves the maintenance dredging of the mooring basin to -10’ MLW within the facility’s breakwaters. The proposal as described, will remove approximately 4,500 cubic yards of material to be placed upland on USCG property, within a sedimentation basin utilizing a New York State sediment trap control structure to retain discharges from the material. The sediment basin will be constructed at the same location as used for prior dredging events. The USCG Station Fire Island Mooring Basin was last dredged in 1992.

Any interested parties and/or agencies desiring to express their views concerning the above proposed activities may do so by filing their comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., 15 days from the date of publication of this notice, or, December 9, 2010.

This notice is promulgated in accordance with Title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 930.

The Commissioner of Taxation and Finance hereby sets the interest rates for the months of January, February, March, 2011 pursuant to sections 697(j) and 1096(e) of the Tax Law, as follows:

For purposes of section 697(j) the overpayment rate of interest is set at 2 percent per annum, and the underpayment rate of interest is set at 7-1/2 percent per annum. For purposes of section 1096(e), the overpayment rate of interest is set at 2 percent per annum, and the underpayment rate of interest is set at 7-1/2 percent per annum. (The underpayment rates set pursuant to sections 697(j) and 1096(e) may not be less than 7-1/2 percent per annum.) Pursuant to section 1145(a)(1) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for State and local sales and use taxes administered by the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance is 14-1/2 percent per annum. The underpayment rate for the special assessments on hazardous waste imposed by section 27-0923 of the Environmental Conservation Law is 15 percent.

* The Tax Law requires the interest rate on sales tax assessments or late payments to be set at 14-1/2% for this quarter. However, if the Commissioner determines that the failure to pay or the delay in payment is due to reasonable cause and not willful neglect, the Commissioner may impose interest at the corporation tax late payment and assessment rate. That rate is 7.5% for this quarter.

** There are a number of state and local governmental bodies that have interest rates tied to the overpayment and underpayment rates contained in either section 697(j) (Income Tax) or section 1096(e) (Corporation Tax) of the Tax Law. For purposes of section 697(j) and section 1096(e) of the Tax Law, the overpayment rate for this period

is 2%. For purposes of section 697(j) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for this period is 7.5%. For purposes of section 1096(e) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for this period is also 7.5%.
