Notice of Review for the Town of Clay
Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program

PURSUANT to Article 42 of the New York State Executive Law and 19 NYCRR Part 601, the New York State Department of State (DOS) has accepted a Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) for the Town of Clay, located within Onondaga County. The LWRP serves as a comprehensive management program for the Town's waterfront resources along the Seneca River, Oneida River, and the Erie Canal.

To approve the Town of Clay LWRP, the Secretary of State must find that it is consistent with Article 42 of the Executive Law and that it does not conflict with existing state programs and policies. Since state agency actions must be consistent with an approved LWRP, Article 42 requires that the public and any potentially affected state and regional agencies be given the opportunity to comment on the proposed program.
