The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activities described below, which are subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The applicant, Mr. Al Nolletti, through his acting agent Tim Miller and Associates, has certified that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the New York State Coastal Management Program and the federally approved Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) of the Village of Mamaroneck. The federal consistency certification and accompanying public information and data is available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at One Commerce Plaza, 99 Washington Avenue in Albany, New York. The Applicant has obtained federal authorization to undertake this activity, as it was originally proposed to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers -NY District, under Nationwide Permits Nos. 14

and 43 [NAN-2009-01111-EBU]. This authorization is conditional on the applicant's receipt of the required coastal zone management concurrence or waiver from the New York State Department of State and the New York state Department of Environmental Conservation. No work may be accomplished until the required approvals are obtained.

In F-2010-0945, the applicant proposes a residential subdivision at 800 Fenimore Road, referred to as the Nolles Ridge subdivision, within the Village of Mamaroneck, Westchester County, New York and to be sited entirely within the Village's approved coastal zone management boundary. The proposed development would construct a 7-unit residential subdivision and paved access road on a presently undeveloped site which contains a federally regulated wetland and unnamed tributary stream to the Sheldrake River. The proposed development site includes areas of relatively higher elevation and slope which channel water toward these lower elevations within the site. The wetland and stream on site intercept overland storm water runoff to the Sheldrake River (a class C impaired water body flowing into the Mamaroneck Harbor on the Long Island Sound). Issuance of a water quality certification (WQC) from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation is required.

According to the information provided to the Department of State and also that which is contained within the Village of Mamaroneck Planning Board's SEQR long Environmental Assessment form, January 28, 2010, the proposed development would: Construct a storm water detention pond or 'pocket pond' within the wetland and that portion of the site abutting Fenimore Road and existing development along Country Road; would avoid siting residential structures within the wetland and stream areas; would include filling and grading of approximately .22 acres of wetland to build a permanent access road from the existing Fenimore Road; would include rock removal and the removal of trees and vegetation on the site; and, following construction, would implement a landscaping plan to control invasive species and plant remaining wetland areas with native species.

Any interested parties and/or agencies desiring to express their views concerning the above proposed activities may do so by filing their comments, in writing, no later than 4:30 p.m., 15 days from the date of publication of this notice, or, close of business on March 24, 2010.

Notice of Review for the Town of Evans
Draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program Amendment

A proposed amendment to the Town of Evans Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) has been prepared pursuant to provisions of the New York State Waterfront Revitalization of Coastal Areas and Inland Waterways Act and the New York State Coastal

Management Program (NYS CMP). The LWRP serves as a comprehensive management program for the Town's Erie Lake, Eighteen Mile Creek, and Big Sister Creek waterfront resources, and was originally approved by the New York State Secretary of State on February 18, 1987 and incorporated into the State Coastal Management Program on March 26, 1987. The Town subsequently adopted a comprehensive plan, together with new zoning controls, which strengthen the ability of the Town to implement the policies and uses set forth in the LWRP. The LWRP is being updated and amended to reflect the new zoning controls and elements of the comprehensive plan. Upon approval by the Secretary of State, the Department of State intends to request its incorporation into the NYS CMP.

To approve this amendment to the Town of Evans LWRP, pursuant Article 42 of the NYS Executive Law, it is required that potentially affected State, federal, and local agencies be consulted to assure that it does not conflict with existing policies and programs. For this purpose, the draft Evans LWRP amendment is available online at <http://nyswaterfronts.com/LWRP.asp>. The draft LWRP amendment was accepted by the New York State Department of State as complete and is now available for review by potentially affected State, federal, and local agencies and the general public. Comments on the draft LWRP amendment are due by May 9, 2011.

**Department of Taxation and Finance
Interest Rates**

The Commissioner of Taxation and Finance hereby sets the interest rates for the months of April, May, June, 2011 pursuant to sections 697(j) and 1096(e) of the Tax Law, as follows:

For purposes of section 697(j) the overpayment rate of interest is set at 3 percent per annum, and the underpayment rate of interest is set at 7-1/2 percent per annum. For purposes of section 1096(e), the overpayment rate of interest is set at 3 percent per annum, and the underpayment rate of interest is set at 8 percent per annum. (The underpayment rates set pursuant to sections 697(j) and 1096(e) may not be less than 7-1/2 percent per annum.) Pursuant to section 1145(a)(1) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for State and local sales and use taxes administered by the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance is 14-1/2 percent per annum. The underpayment rate for the special assessments on hazardous waste imposed by section 27-0923 of the Environmental Conservation Law is 15 percent.

For the interest rates applicable to overpayments (refunds) and underpayments (late payments and assessments) of the following taxes administered by the Commissioner of Taxation and Finance for the period April 1, 2011 through June 30, 2011, see the table below:

* The Tax Law requires the interest rate on sales tax assessments or late payments to be set at 14-1/2% for this quarter. However, if the Commissioner determines that the failure to pay or the delay in payment is due to reasonable cause and not willful neglect, the Commissioner may impose interest at the corporation tax late payment and assessment rate. That rate is 8% for this quarter.

** There are a number of state and local governmental bodies that have interest rates tied to the overpayment and underpayment rates contained in either section 697(j) (Income Tax) or section 1096(e) (Corporation Tax) of the Tax Law. For purposes of section 697(j) and section 1096(e) of the Tax Law, the overpayment rate for this period is 3%. For purposes of section 697(j) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for this period is 7.5%. For purposes of section 1096(e) of the Tax Law, the underpayment rate for this period is 8%.
