2011 S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program

The following is an update to a previous Notice of Availability of State and Federal Funds regarding the 2011 S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program originally published in the August 24, 2011 edition of the New York State Register and subsequently redacted September 7, 2011:

The New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) is issuing a Request for Applications (RFA) to solicit applications for awards under the federally funded grant program entitled "S.T.O.P. (Services, Training, Officers, Prosecutors) Violence Against Women Act (VAWA)" for the purpose of developing and strengthening effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies and victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women.

Subject to State appropriation authority, approximately \$7 million is available for funding the 2011 S.T.O.P. VAWA projects. DCJS grantees currently receiving federal S.T.O.P. VAWA funds are eligible to apply for awards based on the guidelines set forth in the RFA, including geographic need and the needs of underserved populations. Grant award agreements will generally be for a 12-month period with an earliest contract start date of July 1, 2011, latest contract end date of December 31, 2012, and two (2) 1-year renewal options.

Applications received on or before 11:59 p.m. (EST), October 7, 2011 via DCJS' on-line Grants Management System (GMS) will be accepted.

Empire State Medical, Dental and Veterinary Student Stem Cell Research Training Program

The New York State Department of Health invites eligible applicants to submit applications in response to this Request for Applications (RFA), which provides funding for training opportunities for researchers at all levels and to support the continued training of researchers with exceptional potential for making significant contributions to the field of stem cell-related research. Thus, the Empire State Stem Cell Board (ESSCB) wishes to devote directed resources to provide stem cell research training experiences for New York State medical, dental and veterinary students.

All awards will be financed by the Empire State Stem Cell Trust Fund. The number of awards and total funds awarded per application will be contingent upon the quality of applications submitted and the size and scope of the proposed projects. Approximately \$1.5 million is available to support an estimated 20 awards from this RFA. This funding is for a period up to three years. Awards may not exceed \$70,942 in direct costs. Additionally, funds will be available to support Facilities and Administrative costs of up to eight percent of the modified total direct costs. Based on its assessment that the field is ready to pursue additional investigations, the ESSCB Funding Committee may determine that additional funds should be made available under this RFA to support additional awards.

Eligible Recipients:

The applicant must be an accredited not-for-profit or governmental medical (including osteopathy), dental or veterinary school in New York State. Organizations awarded funds will be expected to monitor funds, maintain individual accounts and fulfill other fiscal management criteria. Subcontracting and collaborating organizations may include public, not-for-profit and for-profit entities within or outside of New York State.

The eligible principal investigator (PI)/program director (PD) for the application is employed by the applicant institution and has the scientific background, leadership and administrative capabilities required to coordinate the proposed research training program. An individual may serve as a PI/PD on only one application in response to this RFA and only one application will be accepted from any one medical, dental or veterinary school. In the event that more than one application is received from a PI/PD or school, all applications from that PI/PD or school will be disqualified.

Institutional Awards for Short Term Faculty Training and Col- laborative Opportunities

The New York State Department of Health invites eligible applicants to submit applications in response to this Request for Applications (RFA), which provides funding for training and collaborative opportunities for researchers at all levels, to accelerate development of new therapies and diagnostic methods. The intent of this initiative is to support the continued training and collaborative efforts of researchers who have exceptional potential for making signif-

icant contributions to the field of stem cell-related research and to enable them to develop new skills and interact with researchers at other institutions within and outside of New York State. This RFA provides funding for New York institutions to support a total of up to six months of such activities to be shared among two or more faculty members/investigators over a three-year period.

Projects will be supported by the Empire State Stem Cell Trust Fund. The number of awards and total funds awarded per application will be contingent upon the quality of applications submitted as well as the size and scope of the proposed projects. Approximately \$1 million is available to support more than 30 three-year awards from this RFA. No award may exceed \$31,500 in direct costs. No Facilities and Administrative costs will be supported. Based on its assessment that the field is ready to pursue additional investigations, the Empire State Stem Cell Board (ESSCB) Funding Committee may determine that additional funds should be made available under this RFA to support additional awards.

Eligible Recipients:

The applicant must be a New York State not-for-profit or governmental organization that has previously applied for funding through NYSTEM. The New York State Department of Health's Wadsworth Center is not eligible to apply. Organizations awarded funds will be expected to monitor funds, maintain individual accounts and fulfill other fiscal management criteria. Subcontracting and collaborating organizations may include public, not-for-profit and for-profit entities within or outside of New York State.

The eligible principal investigator (PI)/program director (PD) for the application is employed by the applicant institution and possesses the scientific background, leadership and administrative capabilities required to coordinate, supervise and direct the proposed short term faculty training program described in the Workplan. An individual may serve as a PI/PD on only one application in response to this RFA and only one application will be accepted from any single institution. In the event that more than one application is received from a PI/PD or institution, all applications from that PI/PD or institution will be disqualified.
