PLEASE TAKE NOTICE OF A REFERENDUM to be conducted by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets of the State of New York, pursuant to Article 25 of the Agriculture and Markets Law and § 205.12 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York (1 NYCRR) on whether the New York State Cabbage Research and Development Program should be continued. The continuation of the order is subject to the approval of not less than 50 percent of all New York State cabbage growers participating in the referendum.

Any person who, in 2011, produced or caused to be produced cabbage in the State of New York for any market is a grower entitled to vote in this referendum. Each producer is entitled to one vote.

The stated purpose of the project is to protect the subflooring of structure from wave energy and storm damages. No alternative actions have been proposed by the applicant.

the cavity once housed turbines used in the operation of the former pumice mill. The site location is adjacent to the Van Amringe Mill Pond which is identified as a significant habitat within the LWRP. The cavity, though situated beneath the building, is presently exposed to tidal action and comprises approximately +/- 342 square feet of tidal wetland and it is visible from a vantage point on the water.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On March 15, 2012, the Commission approved the release of a proposed Low Flow Protection Policy for public review and comment. The Policy was developed over the past year in coordination with the Commission's Water Resources Management Advisory Committee to improve low flow protection standards associated with approved water withdrawals. The improvements are largely based on scientific advances in ecosystem flow protection. The Commission will use the Policy and supporting technical guidance when reviewing withdrawal applications to establish limits and conditions on approvals consistent with the Commission's regulatory standards (18 CFR § 806.23).
